

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SATURDAY, MAY 13, 2006 1000 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 49 new fires reported. No new large fires were reported. Three large fires were contained, two in the Southern Area and one in the Western Great Basin Area. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, Oklahoma, Utah, New Mexico and Texas.

SOUTHERN AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

ARECA, Florida Division of Forestry. A Florida State Type 2 Incident Management Team (Jones) is assigned. The Team is also managing the Tosohatchee fire. A transfer of command from the Type 2 Incident Management Team back to the local unit will occur tomorrow. This fire started on private land six miles northwest of Sharpes, FL in southern rough. Smoke and fog on State route 528 and Interstate 95 continues to be a concern. Good progress was made on line construction.

WF NEW SMYRNA 44/95, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is one mile west of New Smyrna, FL in southern rough. Some roads in the area were closed at times due to smoke and fog. Burned trees along the freeway are being removed. Minimal fire activity was reported.

RASELY ROAD, Florida Division of Forestry. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Beauchamp) is assigned. The team is also managing the WF New Smyrna 44/95 fire. This fire is in Volusia County, FL in southern rough. Smoke and fog on area roadways continues to be a concern. Fire activity was minimal.

BERG, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is 14 miles south of Belle Grade, FL in grass. Burn out operations are continuing. No further information was received.

TOSOHATCHEE, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is six miles southwest of Titusville, FL in timber and southern rough. Fire activity was minimal due to increased relative humidity. Increase in acreage is due to more accurate mapping.

BIG BEND, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Osceola County, FL in southern rough. Active fire behavior was reported. State route 192 was temporarily closed in the morning. Active burning within the perimeter was reported.

29 POWELL, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Hillsborough County, FL in grass. Minimal fire activity was reported.
