

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
TUESDAY, MAY 16, 2006 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 180 new fires reported. Five new large fires (*) were reported in the Southern Area. Two large fires were contained in the Southern and Eastern Great Basin Areas. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, Nevada, New Mexico and Utah.

SOUTHERN AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

ARECA, Florida Division of Forestry. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Jones) is assigned. The Team is also managing the Tosohatchee fire. This fire started on private land six miles northwest of Sharpes, FL in southern rough. Difficult access and falling snags are hampering containment efforts. Smoke is impacting traffic flow along nearby roads.

RASELY ROAD, Florida Division of Forestry. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Beauchamp) is assigned. The Team is also managing the WF New Smyrna 44/95 fire. This fire is 10 miles northeast of Deltona, FL in southern rough. Residences remain threatened. Smoke is creating hazardous conditions on highways. Interstate 95 continues to be intermittently closed during early morning hours.

WF NEW SMYRNA 44/95, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is one mile west of New Smyrna, FL in southern rough. Numerous residences remain threatened. Interstate 95 continues to be closed during early morning hours. Smoke continues to impact traffic flow on major highways. Reduction in acreage is due to more accurate mapping.

BERG, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is 14 miles south of Belle Glade, FL in grass. Smoke is impacting adjacent roadways. No further information was received.

OK-KPSP-757, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Okeechobee County, FL southern rough. Rapid rates of spread were reported. No further information was received.

TOSOHATCHEE, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is six miles southwest of Titusville, FL in timber and southern rough. The Interstate highway is intermittently closed due to nearby smoke and hot spots.

BIG BEND, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Osceola County, FL in southern rough. A few flare-ups were reported within control lines. No further information was received.

29 POWELL, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Hillsborough County, FL in grass. Minimal fire activity was reported. Smoke along major roads remains a concern.

WF POSSUM CAM, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is two miles west of Edgewater, FL in southern rough and timber. Residential area evacuations are in effect and Interstate 95 is closed. Rapid rates of spread and spotting were observed.

53 RIVER RANCH CAMP AREA, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is near Frostproof, FL in timber. Rapid rates of spread, crown fire and spotting were reported.

HUTTA, Texas Forest Service. This fire is five miles west of Carta Valley, TX in grass. Creeping and single tree torching were reported.

DUMP, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Brevard County, FL in grass. The fire is being monitored.

OUTLOOK:

Red Flag Warning: In effect for the Central Florida panhandle for long durations low humidity in the low to mid 30%.

Weather Discussion: Drier conditions will be in Florida and the adjacent southeastern states in the wake of a cold front that has moved through the area. High pressure remains in the west with enough moisture for some thunderstorms in western Colorado, New Mexico, Arizona, the Great Basin, and a few in the Pacific Northwest.
