

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
THURSDAY, MAY 18, 2006 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 78 new fires reported. Four new large fires (*) were reported, one each in the Southern, Eastern Great Basin, Southwest and Northern Rockies Areas. Three large fires were contained, two in the Southern Area, and one in the Northern Rockies Area. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, Nevada, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas and Utah and Montana.

SOUTHERN AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

ARECA, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire started on private land six miles northwest of Sharpes, FL in southern rough. Precipitation minimized fire activity. Smoke is impacting traffic flow along nearby roads.

RASELY ROAD, Florida Division of Forestry. A transfer of command from a Type 2 Incident Management Team (Beauchamp) back to the local unit will occur. The Team is also managing the WF New Smyrna 44/95 fire. This fire is 10 miles northeast of Deltona, FL in southern rough. Numerous residences remain threatened. Smoke is creating hazardous conditions on highways, and Interstate 95 continues to be intermittently closed during early morning hours. Precipitation minimized fire activity.

WF POSSUM CAMP, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is two miles west of Edgewater, FL in southern rough and timber. Interstate 95 remains closed during the early morning hours due to smoke and fog. Recent rainfall has slowed fire activity.

WF NEW SMYRNA 44/95, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is one mile west of New Smyrna, FL in southern rough. Numerous residences remain threatened. Precipitation minimized fire activity. Interstate 95 continues to be closed during early morning hours due to smoky conditions.

BERG, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is 14 miles south of Belle Glade, FL in grass. The fire received heavy precipitation. Smoke continues to impact roadways. The fire continues to burn in pockets of fuel.

TOSOHATCHEE, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is six miles southwest of Titusville, FL in timber and southern rough. Difficult access to portions of the fire continues to be a problem. Fire activity was minimal.

29 POWELL, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Hillsborough County, FL in grass. Minimal fire activity was reported.

BIG BEND, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Osceola County, FL in southern rough. Up to half and inch of precipitation fell on the fire. Creeping in pockets of fuel was observed.

OK-KPSP-757, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Okeechobee County, FL in southern rough. Minimal fire behavior was observed.

FRIDAY ROAD, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Brevard County, FL in grass. Fire activity was minimal. Reduction in acres is due to better reporting.

B & B, Oklahoma Division of Forestry. This fire started on private land 12 miles south of Tahlequah, OK in hardwood litter. No new information was reported.

RATTLESNAKE, Arizona Strip Field Office, Bureau of Land Management. This fire is 40 miles south of St. George, UT in pinyon pine and grass. Very active fire behavior along ridge tops was reported.

OUTLOOK:

Fire Weather Watch: A fire weather watch is in effect in south Florida as well as the central and eastern Florida Panhandle. Relative humidity values below 35% are expected to last more than four hours.

Weather Discussion: A strong high pressure ridge is situated over the West today, and a low pressure trough is in the East. A mixture of dry and wet thunderstorms will be in many of the western states again this afternoon, and the Southwest will see fewer thunderstorms than in the past few days. Florida will continue to have low afternoon humidity.
