

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
FRIDAY, MAY 26, 2006 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 54 new fires reported. One new large fire (*) was reported in the Eastern Great Basin Area. Two large fires were contained in the Southern Area. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, Kansas, Nebraska, Oklahoma, Texas New Mexico, Colorado and Utah.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

TEST SITE, Southwest Area, Utah Division of Forestry and State Lands. This fire is 20 miles northeast of St. George, UT in pinyon pine, grass and brush. Numerous residences and utility infrastructure are threatened. Running and spotting fire behavior was observed.

SOUTHWEST AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

ROMERO, Coronado National Forest. A transfer of command from a Type 1 Incident Management Team (Oltrogge) back to the local unit will occur tonight. This fire is six miles southeast of Oro Valley, AZ in brush. Minimal fire activity was observed.

NORTH TAYLOR, Coronado National Forest. This fire is 19 miles southwest of Safford, AZ in timber and brush. No new information was reported.

ADOBE, Socorro District, New Mexico State Forestry. This fire is 28 miles southeast of Animas, NM in mixed conifer forest and grass. Burn out operations are ongoing. No further information was received.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

BLACK RIDGE, Southern Ute Agency, Bureau of Indian Affairs. This fire is 12 miles south of Durango, CO in pinyon pine and juniper. Two residences remain threatened. Short range spotting and active fire behavior was observed.

SOUTHERN AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

PALO DURA EAST, Texas Forest Service. This fire, formerly named Palo Dura Canyon, is eight miles northwest of Wayside, TX in grass. Active fire behavior with running on steep slopes and heavy fuels was observed.

WF POSSUM CAMP, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is two miles west of Edgewater, FL in southern rough and timber. No new information was reported.

OUTLOOK:

Red Flag Warnings: Northern Arizona and northeast New Mexico for strong southwest winds and low humidity. For most of western Utah for strong winds and low relative humidity.

Fire Weather Watches: Northwest Arizona for strong southwest winds and low humidity. Guadalupe Mountains of southeast New Mexico for strong south to southwest winds and low humidity.

Weather Discussion: An upper level trough will move over the Northwest today creating strong winds combined with already dry and unstable conditions in place for portions of the Southwest, Great Basin, and Rocky Mountain Areas. Isolated dry thunderstorms are possible for portions of Colorado and northwest Texas.
