Columbia Complex, Southeast, Washington DNR. IMT 1 (Lohrey). IMT 2 ordered. Fifteen miles northeast of Walla Walla, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Single and group torching and short uphill runs. Residences, a ski area and commercial resources threatened.

Polallie, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. IMT 2 (Reed). Fifteen miles northwest of Cle Elum, WA. Subalpine fir, lodgepole pine and brush. Creeping, torching and short runs. Residences, Forest Service structures and campgrounds threatened. Forest road closures in effect.

Twin Lakes Complex (two fires), Wallowa-Whitman NF. IMT 2 (Lunde). Twenty-one miles southeast of Joseph, OR. Timber. Smoldering and single tree torching. Structures, mine sites and recreation sites threatened. Community of Cornucopia evacuated.

Tripod Complex (two fires), Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. IMT 1 (Anderson). IMT also managing Cedar Creek, Tatoosh Complex and Van Peak fires. Seven miles northeast of Winthrop, WA. Mixed conifer. Moderate fire behavior with occasional torching. Communities of Winthrop and Conconully threatened.

Elkhorn Complex (three fires), Wallowa-Whitman NF. IMT 2 (Goheen). Sixteen miles northwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and dead and down fuels. Backing fire, spotting and group tree torching.

Flick Creek, North Cascades NP. FUMT (Furlong). FUMT also managing Tinpan WFU. One mile east of Stehekin, WA. Mixed conifer. Backing fire, torching and short crown runs. Community of Stehekin threatened.

7440, South Puget Sound, Washington DNR. IMT 2 (LaFave). Started on Forest Service land 30 miles east of Enumclaw, WA. Timber and slash. Minimal fire behavior. Communications site threatened.

Tinpan, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. Seven miles west of Lucerne, WA. Timber. Single and group tree torching.

Jungle Butte Complex, Yakama Agency, BIA. IMT 2 (Barnett). Nine miles northeast of Glenwood, WA. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Cultural sites threatened.

Cascade Crest Complex (three fires), Deschutes NF. Transfer of command from IMT 1 (Wilcock) to local unit today. Forty-two miles northwest of Bend, OR. Timber and heavy dead and down fuels. Isolated torching and creeping.

Middle Fork, Cascade District, Oregon Department of Forestry. ODF IMT (Walker). Started on private land 14 miles northeast of Sweet Home, OR. Timber. Creeping and smoldering.

Bisbee Mountain, Northeast, Washington DNR. IMT 2 (Gormley). Five miles west of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber. Torching, short crown runs and spotting. Structures threatened.

Cedar Creek, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. Eight miles southwest of Mazama, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Residences and commercial property threatened.

Tatoosh Complex (six fires), Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. Twenty-four miles northwest of Mazama, WA. Timber. Smoldering, creeping and occasional torching. Canadian IMT assigned to Canadian portion of the fire.

Shake Table Complex, Malheur NF. Nine miles southeast of Dayville, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior.

Mt. Hood Complex, Mt. Hood NF. Six miles east of Government Camp, OR. Timber and heavy dead and down fuels. Minimal fire behavior.

Van Peak, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. Thirty-one miles north of Winthrop, WA. Timber and heavy down fuel. Smoldering, creeping and torching.

Derby, Gallatin NF. IMT 1 (Bennett). Fifteen miles south of Big Timber, MT. Timber, grass and heavy dead and down fuels. Active torching, short runs and backing fire. Residences, mine sites and grazing allotments threatened.

Paradise Valley Complex (three fires), Gallatin NF. IMT 2 (Kusicko). Twenty-nine miles southwest of Livingston, MT. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Structures and watershed threatened. Structure protection in place.

Meadow, Nez Perce NF. IMT 2 (Turman). Fifteen miles southeast of Elk City, ID. Timber. Smoldering ground fire and torching. Residences and other structures threatened. Area road closures and structure protection in place.

Hughes 32 Complex (two fires), Idaho Panhandle NF. Sixteen miles northwest of Nordman, ID. Cedar, hemlock and subalpine fir. Minimal fire behavior, torching and small uphill runs. A fire lookout and Canadian power lines threatened. Area trails closed.

Ashley Lake, Flathead Agency BIA. Six miles northeast of St. Ignatius, MT. Timber. Backing fire and short uphill runs. Structures, cultural sites and watershed threatened

Heaven's Gate Complex (four fires), Nez Perce NF. IMT 2 (Grant). Ten miles west of Riggins, ID. Grass and timber. Torching and active surface fire. Residences and other structures threatened. Numerous roads closed and structure protection in place.

Holland Peak, Flathead NF. IMT 2 (Heintz) Five miles east of Condon, MT. Timber. Backing fire, torching, and spotting. Residences threatened. Voluntary evacuation in effect.

Jungle, Gallatin NF. FUMT (Svalberg). Twenty miles southeast of Livingston, MT. Timber. Torching, short crown runs, spotting, backing fire and uphill runs. Ranches, Forest Service structures, and one helicopter threatened. Structure protection in place.

Sun Dog, Flathead NF. Eighteen miles north of Whitefish, MT. Timber. Surface fire and torching. Watershed and endangered species habitat threatened.

Ulm Peak, Idaho Panhandle NF. Twelve miles southwest of Noxon, MT. Subalpine fir, hemlock and brush. Moderate fire behavior, torching and spotting.

Long Canyon Creek, Idaho Panhandle NF. Eighteen miles northwest of Bonners Ferry, ID. Subalpine fir and spruce. Minimal fire behavior.

Ross Complex, (three fires), Kootenai NF. Fourteen miles southwest of Troy, MT. Subalpine fir, Douglas fir and brush. Moderate fire behavior.

East Roaring, Boise NF. IMT 2 (Suwyn). Thirteen miles northeast of Pine, ID. Timber. Single and group tree torching. Road closures and structure protection in place.

Rattlesnake Complex (two fires), Boise NF. IMT 1 (Muir). Thirteen miles northeast of Garden Valley, ID. Subalpine fir, pine and grass. Moderate fire behavior, group tree torching and short runs. Residences, commercial property, a lookout and Forest Service guard station threatened.

Middle Fork Complex (eight fires), Salmon-Challis NF. FUMT (Perkins). Thirty miles west of Challis, ID. Timber and grass. Light precipitation. Moderate fire behavior. Structure protection in place.

Cuddy Complex, Payette NF. IMT 2 (Thomas). Eighteen miles west of Council, ID. Grass, sagebrush and timber. Torching and creeping. Structures and power lines threatened.

Red Mountain, Boise NF. IMT 1 (Broyles). IMT also managing the Boundary Complex and Knapp #2 fires. Sixteen miles northeast of Lowman, ID. Subalpine fir and lodgepole pine. Group and single tree torching. Campgrounds, Forest Service guard station, fisheries habitat and cultural sites threatened.

South Fork Complex (26 fires), Payette NF. FUMT (Reinarz). Thirteen miles east of McCall, ID. Timber and brush. Ground fire and single tree torching. Community of Yellow Pine, lookouts, a communication site and campgrounds threatened.

Rockland, Idaho Falls District, BLM. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (Whalen) to local unit today. Five miles east of Rockland, ID. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior. This will be the last report.

Boundary Complex (three fires), Salmon-Challis NF. Fourteen miles southeast of Landmark, ID. Timber with heavy dead and down fuels. Creeping, smoldering and single tree torching. Structures and mine sites threatened. Structure protection in place.

Battle Mountain, Bridger-Teton NF. Thirty miles northeast of Pinedale, WY. Timber. Minimal fire behavior.

Trout Creek, Payette NF. FUMT (Hall). FUMT also managing Payette WFU Complex. Fifty miles northeast of McCall, ID. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior. Monitor status. This will be the last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

Payette WFU Complex (thirteen fires), Payette NF. Twenty miles northeast of McCall, ID. Timber. Backing and flanking. Monitor status.

Knapp #2, Salmon-Challis NF. Sixteen miles northwest of Stanley, ID. Grass, brush and heavy timber. No new information.

Predictive Services Discussion

Warmer and drier through Wednesday then colder Thursday through Sunday with good chance of rain and mountain snow for the Northwest, Idaho and Montana. A building high pressure ridge will bring warmer and drier weather to most of the West. The ridge will breakdown Wednesday with gusty winds developing over portions of the Northwest, Northern Rockies and the north half of the Great Basin. A strong upper low developing over the Northwest Thursday will bring widespread rain and mountain snow to most of the Northwest, Idaho and Montana for Thursday through Sunday. Further south, strong winds are expected over Nevada Thursday.

DOWNHILL FIRELINE CONSTRUCTION CHECKLIST

Downhill fireline construction is hazardous in step terrain, fast-burning fuels, or rapidly changing weather. Downhill fireline construction should not be attempted unless there is no tactical alternative. When building downhill fireline, the following is required:

- Crew supervisor(s) and fireline overhead will discuss assignments prior to committing crew(s). Responsible overhead individual (TFLD or ICT4 qualified or better) will stay with job until completed.
- Decision will be made after proposed fireline has been scouted by supervisor(s) of involved crew(s).
- LCES will be coordinated for all personnel involved.
 - Crew supervisor(s) is in direct contact with lookout who can see the fire.
 - Communication is established between all crews.
 - Ensure rapid access to safety zone(s) in case fire crosses below crew(s).
- Direct attack will be used whenever possible; if not possible, the fireline should be completed between anchor points before being fired out.
- Fireline will not lie in or adjacent to a chute or chimney.
- Starting point will be anchored for crew(s) building fireline down from the top.
- Bottom of the fire will be monitored; if the potential exists for the fire to spread, action will be taken to secure the fire edge.
