Flick Creek, North Cascades NP. FUMT (Furlong). FUMT also managing Tinpan WFU. One mile east of Stehekin, WA. Mixed conifer. Upslope runs, backing and flanking fire. Community of Stehekin threatened.

Tripod Complex (two fires), Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. IMT 1 (Anderson). IMT also managing Cedar Creek, Tatoosh Complex and Van Peak fires. Seven miles northeast of Winthrop, WA. Mixed conifer. Backing fire, occasional torching and short crown runs. Structures, historical and cultural sites threatened.

Columbia Complex, Southeast, Washington DNR. Transfer of command from IMT 1 (Lohrey) to IMT 2 (Jennings) today. Fifteen miles northeast of Walla Walla, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Backing fire. Residences, a ski area and commercial resources threatened.

Polallie, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. IMT 2 (Reed). Fifteen miles northwest of Cle Elum, WA. Subalpine fir, lodgepole pine and brush. Spotting, torching, running and creeping. Residences, Forest Service structures and campgrounds threatened. Forest road closures in effect.

Elkhorn Complex (three fires), Wallowa-Whitman NF. IMT 2 (Goheen). Sixteen miles northwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and dead and down fuels. Spotting and backing fire. Structures threatened.

Twin Lakes Complex (two fires), Wallowa-Whitman NF. IMT 2 (Lunde). Twenty-one miles southeast of Joseph, OR. Timber. Short range spotting and creeping. Structures, mine and recreation sites threatened.

Tinpan, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. Seven miles west of Lucerne, WA. Timber. Single and group tree torching.

Bisbee Mountain, Northeast, Washington DNR. IMT 2 (Gormley). Five miles west of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber. Isolated torching. Structures threatened.

Jungle Butte Complex, Yakama Agency, BIA. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (Barnett) to local unit today. Nine miles northeast of Glenwood, WA. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Native gathering grounds and cultural sites threatened.

Puzzle, Willamette NF. Previously reported. Southeast of Idanha, OR . Timber and dead and down fuels. Torching, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened.

Cedar Creek, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. Eight miles southwest of Mazama, WA. Timber. Minimal fire activity. Residences and commercial property threatened.

Tatoosh Complex (six fires), Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. Twenty-four miles northwest of Mazama, WA. Timber. Torching and short duration crown runs. Residences threatened. Canadian IMT assigned to Canadian portion of the fire.

Van Peak, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. Thirty-one miles north of Winthrop, WA. Timber and dead and down fuels. Torching, creeping and smoldering.

Shake Table Complex, Malheur NF. Nine miles southeast of Dayville, OR. Timber.

Middle Fork, Cascade District, ODF. Started on private land 14 miles northeast of Sweet Home, OR. Timber. Creeping and smoldering. No new information received.

Williams Lake Road, Spokane District, BLM. Eleven miles northeast of Sprague, WA. Grass, brush and ponderosa pine. Spotting and running. Grazing allotments and recreational areas threatened.

Cascade Crest Complex (three fires), Deschutes NF. Forty-two miles northwest of Bend, OR. Timber and heavy dead and down fuels. No new information reported. Last report unless new information is received.

Derby, Gallatin NF. IMT 1 (Bennett and Stanich). Fifteen miles south of Big Timber, MT. Timber, grass and heavy dead and down fuels. Group torching and short runs. Residences, mine sites and grazing allotments threatened.

Paradise Valley Complex (three fires), Gallatin NF. IMT 2 (Kusicko). Twenty-nine miles southwest of Livingston, MT. Timber. Isolated torching and short runs. Structures and municipal watershed threatened. Structure protection in place.

Heaven's Gate Complex (four fires), Nez Perce NF. IMT 2 (Grant). Nine miles west of Riggins, ID. Grass and timber. Torching and surface fire. Residences and other structures threatened; structure protection in place. Numerous roads closed.

Meadow, Nez Perce NF. IMT 2 (Turman). Fifteen miles southeast of Elk City, ID. Timber. Isolated and group tree torching, and short uphill runs. Residences and other structures threatened. Area road closures and structure protection in place.

Hughes 32 Complex (two fires), Idaho Panhandle NF. Ten miles north of Nordman, ID. Cedar, hemlock and subalpine fir. Short runs, spotting, torching and backing fire. A fire lookout and Canadian power lines threatened. Area trails closed.

Ashley Lake, Flathead Agency BIA. Six miles northeast of St. Ignatius, MT. Timber. Crown runs, torching and backing fire. Structures, cultural sites and a watershed threatened

Jungle, Gallatin NF. FUMT (Svalberg). Twenty miles southeast of Livingston, MT. Timber. Torching, long range spotting, running and crowning. Ranches and Forest Service structures threatened. Evacuations in effect, and structure protection in place.

Holland Peak, Flathead NF. IMT 2 (Heintz) Five miles east of Condon, MT. Timber. Smoldering, creeping and low intensity ground fire. Residences threatened.

Sun Dog, Flathead NF. Eighteen miles north of Whitefish, MT. Timber. Torching and surface fire. Watershed and endangered species habitat threatened.

Ulm Peak, Idaho Panhandle NF. Twelve miles southwest of Noxon, MT. Subalpine fir, hemlock and brush. Spotting, and single and group tree torching.

Revett Complex, Idaho Panhandle NF. Five miles southeast of Murray, ID. Timber and brush. Torching and creeping.

Ross Complex, (three fires), Kootenai NF. Fourteen miles southwest of Troy, MT. Subalpine fir, Douglas fir and brush. Torching and backing fire.

Long Canyon Creek, Idaho Panhandle NF. Eighteen miles northwest of Bonners Ferry, ID. Subalpine fir and spruce. Creeping, smoldering and single tree torching.

Rattlesnake Complex (two fires), Boise NF. IMT 1 (Muir). Thirteen miles northeast of Garden Valley, ID. Subalpine fir, pine and grass. Group torching and creeping fire. Residences, commercial property, a lookout and Forest Service guard station threatened.

South Fork Complex (26 fires), Payette NF. FUMT (Reinarz). Thirteen miles east of McCall, ID. Timber and brush. Short runs and single tree torching. Community of Yellow Pine, communications sites and a lookout threatened.

Red Mountain, Boise NF. IMT 1 (Broyles). IMT also managing the Boundary Complex. Sixteen miles northeast of Lowman, ID. Subalpine fir and lodgepole pine. Group and single tree torching and short uphill runs. Campgrounds, fisheries habitat and cultural sites threatened.

Boundary Complex (four fires), Salmon-Challis NF. Fourteen miles southeast of Landmark, ID. Timber with heavy dead and down fuels. Single and group tree torching with short uphill runs. Structures and mine sites threatened; structure protection in place.

Middle Fork Complex (thirteen fires), Salmon-Challis NF. FUMT (Perkins). IMT 2 (Lund) ordered. Thirty miles west of Challis, ID. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior. Structure protection in place for cabin, mine and other facilities.

Payette WFU Complex (thirteen fires), Payette NF. Twenty miles northeast of McCall, ID. Timber. Backing and flanking fire. Monitor status.

Bear Lake, Payette NF. Twenty-five miles northeast of McCall, ID. Grass and timber. No new information.

Predictive Services Discussion

Warm and dry through Wednesday, then colder Thursday through Sunday with good chance of rain and mountain snow for the Northwest, Idaho, Montana, and Wyoming. A high pressure ridge will continue warm and dry weather for most of the West today. Winds will increase today and continue through Thursday over much of the northwest quarter of the country ahead of a strong low pressure system. The weather system will bring widespread rain and mountain snow to most of the Northwest, Idaho, Montana, and Wyoming Thursday through Sunday. Another weather system is on tap for early next week with additional precipitation for the same areas.

EXTREME FIRE BEHAVIOR

Extreme fire behavior has always been present in cases of shelter deployment. It is critical for firefighters to maintain situational awareness of live and dead fuel moisture conditions as well as predicted and current weather conditions. As fire behavior changes, it is critical to act decisively to the changing situation.

● Discuss the following indicators of extreme fire behavior:

- Relative humidity less than 15%
- 1-hour fuel moisture less than 5%
- Trees crowning inside the fireline
- Smoldering fires that exist in the early part of the day are beginning to burn very actively as the day progresses.
- Approaching thunderheads with dark clouds beneath
- Presence of dust devils indicating an unstable atmosphere
- Increased spotting
- Sudden calm
- High clouds moving fast in direction different from surface wind
- Predicted Haines Index of 5 and 6 in those areas where this level is a good indicator of atmospheric instability
