Sawmill Complex (4 fires), Lolo NF. IMT 2 (Angell). Twenty-two miles southeast of Missoula, MT. Timber and grass. Active surface fire with group tree torching, crown runs and mid-range spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations in effect.

Jocko Lakes, Flathead Agency, BIA. IMT 1 (Hoff). Twenty-six miles northeast of Missoula, MT. Timber with dead and down lodgepole pine. Smoldering with occasional torching. Residences and commercial property threatened.

Rattlesnake, Nez Perce NF. IMT 2 (Grant). Twenty-five miles south of Elk City, ID. Timber and grass. Smoldering, creeping and backing with isolated torching. Structures threatened.

Rombo Mountain, Bitterroot NF. IMT 1 (Quesinberry). IMT also managing the Rat Creek and Pattengail Creek fires. Eighteen miles south of Darby, MT. Bug-killed timber. Short crown runs, torching and short-range spotting. Structures threatened.

BH, Bitterroot NF. FUMT (Perkins). FUMT also managing Bitterroot Fire Use Complex fire. Thirty-six miles southwest of Darby, MT. Timber. Backing fire with creeping and smoldering. Intermittent road closures in effect.

Bitterroot Fire Use Complex (14 fires), Bitterroot NF. Fifteen miles west of Darby, MT. Timber and grass. Moderate surface fire with torching.

Chippy Creek, Northwestern Land Office, Montana DNR. IMT 2 (Secrest). Twenty-four miles north of Thompson Falls, MT. Timber, dead and down lodgepole pine with logging slash. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching. Numerous residences threatened.

Ahorn, Lewis and Clark NF. FUMT (Lineback). FUMT also managing the Fool Creek fire. Thirty miles west of Augusta, MT. Timber. Surface fire with group tree torching. Structures threatened.

Fool Creek, Lewis and Clark NF. Thirty miles northwest of Choteau, MT. Timber and snags. Surface fire with isolated torching.

Skyland, Flathead NF. Thirty-two miles east of Kalispell, MT. Timber and grass. Creeping and smoldering with isolated torching. Structures threatened.

WH Complex (2 fires), Gallatin NF. Transfer of command from FUMT (Bonefeld) back to local unit on 9/1. Twenty-seven miles south of Livingston, MT. Timber. Minimal fire activity.

Bridge, Clearwater NF. Forty-five miles southwest of Missoula, MT. Timber and brush. Creeping and smoldering with isolated tree torching.

Black Cat, Southwestern Land Office, Montana DNR. Transfer of command from IMT 1 (Martin) back to local unit today. Started on private land five miles northeast of Frenchtown, MT. Timber. Creeping, smoldering with isolated tree torching. Structures threatened.

Rat Creek, Beaverhead/Deerlodge NF. Twenty-five miles west of Wisdom, MT. Timber. Moderate fire activity with crown runs and short-range spotting. Structures, historic and cultural sites threatened.

Pattengail Creek, Beaverhead/Deerlodge NF. Ten miles northeast of Wisdom, MT. Timber with dead and down fuels. Moderate activity with short crown runs and short-range spotting. Residences threatened.

Conger Creek, Lolo NF. Twenty miles north of Ovando, MT. Timber. Active fire behavior with group tree torching.

Corporal, Flathead NF. Forty-seven miles southeast of Kalispell, MT. Timber. Active fire with single tree torching, short crown runs and spotting. Structures threatened.

Columbine 1, Yellowstone NP. Fifty-three miles west of Cody, WY. Timber. Moderate surface fire with smoldering and isolated torching.

Boundary Junction, Clearwater NF. Fifteen miles southeast of Pierce, ID. Timber, brush and grass. Smoldering and isolated torching. Last report unless new information is received.

Area Command Team (Loach) is assigned to manage large fires for the Boise and Payette National Forests.

Castle Rock, Sawtooth NF. IMT 1 (Pincha-Tulley). Three miles west of Ketchum, ID. Timber, heavy dead and down fuels, brush and grass. Active surface fire with torching and spotting. Evacuations and forest closures in effect.

Cascade Complex (2 fires), Boise NF. IMT 1 (Muir). Twenty-seven miles east of Cascade, ID. Timber. Group tree torching with short crown runs and spotting. Local communities, cultural sites, and historical cabins are threatened. Evacuations in effect.

East Zone Complex (3 fires), Payette NF. NIMO (Ferguson). Twenty-five miles northeast of McCall, ID. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate surface fire with creeping, smoldering and short runs. Communities of Secesh, South Fork and Warren threatened. Voluntary evacuations in effect.

Shower Bath Complex (3 fires), Salmon-Challis NF. FUMT (Reinarz). Eighteen miles northwest of Challis, ID. Timber with heavy dead and down fuels. Creeping and smoldering with isolated torching. Structures, historic cabins and cultural sites threatened.

Krassel Complex (6 fires), Payette NF. FUMT (Hahnenberg). Forty-four miles northeast of Yellow Pine, ID. Timber, grass and heavy dead and down fuels. Active fire behavior with isolated torching and short crown runs. Structures threatened.

ENTRAPMENT AVOIDANCE

Entrapment Avoidance is described in the NWCG Glossary as follows: "A process used to improve the safety of personnel on the fireline, which emphasizes tools and tactics available to prevent being trapped in a burnover situation. This process includes appropriate decision making through risk management, application of LCES, use of pre-established trigger points, and recognition of suitable escape routes and safety zones.

- Avoiding situations where firefighters become entrapped is the first concern when devising strategy and tactics. The following discussion points are among the things that should be considered.

● Review how LCES relates to the 10 Standard Fire Orders.
