National Firefighter Safety Stand Down

The National Firefighter Safety Stand Down is a nation-wide initiative sponsored by the International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC). The intent of the program is to focus the attention of all firefighters on safety by way of a 'stand down' on June 21. While realizing that full participation is at the discretion of each agency, the NWCG Safety and Health Working Team would like to support the IAFC and the nations structural fire departments in this effort. The focus of this years stand down is emergency vehicle safety. We are asking Wildland Fire organizations to discuss the stand down and to use the following talking points and web links as a starting point for a discussion about vehicle safety in the wildland fire environment.

● Apparatus and Equipment Check

- Check all fire apparatus (engines, helicopters, jumpships) and equipment stowed on fire apparatus.
- Address MANDATORY seat belt use in engines and chase vehicles Discuss your agencies policy on headlight and emergency light use
