Butler 2, San Bernardino NF. Unified command between IMT 2 (Fiorella), CAL FIRE and San Bernardino County. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (Fiorella) to IMT 1 (Opliger) today. Eight miles northeast of Running Springs, CA. Timber, brush and grass. Active fire behavior with torching. Communities threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Angel, Monte Vista Unit, CAL FIRE. CAL FIRE IMT 1 (Windsor). Twelve miles east of Julian, CA. Bug-killed timber and brush. Active fire behavior with spotting. Community of Julian threatened. Evacuations in effect and portion of Highway 18 is closed.

East Zone Complex (4 fires), Payette NF. Transfer of command from IMT 1 (Broyles) to NIMO (Gelobter) today. NIMO will also manage the Donnelly zone of the Grays Creek fire and the Big Creek portion of the Krassel Complex WFU. Twenty-five miles northeast of McCall, ID. Timber. Active fire behavior. Numerous structures threatened. Road closures and evacuations in effect.

Jocko Lakes, Flathead Agency, BIA. IMT 2 (McNitt). Twenty-six miles northeast of Missoula, MT. Timber with dead and down lodgepole pine. Creeping and smoldering with isolated torching.

Conger Creek, Lolo NF. Twenty miles north of Ovando, MT. Timber. Minimal fire activity with isolated torching. Area closures in effect.

Corporal, Flathead NF. Forty-seven miles southeast of Kalispell, MT. Timber. Torching and short crown runs.

Elkhorn Substation, Dakota Prairie National Grasslands. Twelve miles west of Fairfield, ND. Timber and grass. No new information. Last report unless new information is received.
