Area Command Team (Zimmerman). NIMO (Gage) assigned to Shasta-Trinity NF.

BTU Lightning Complex (27 fires), Butte Unit, Cal Fire. Cal Fire IMT 1 (Lewin). Butte County, CA. Timber, brush and grass. Short runs with torching and spotting. Communities of Jonesville, Butte Meadows and Concow threatened. Evacuation orders in effect. Highway 70 closed.

SHU Lightning Complex (158 fires), Shasta-Trinity Unit, Cal Fire. Cal Fire IMT 1 (Kerschen). Shasta and Trinity counties, CA. Timber, brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior. Numerous residences, commercial property and power transmission lines threatened. Communities of Shingletown and Burney threatened. Evacuations in effect.

Mendocino Lightning Complex (107 fires), Mendocino Unit, Cal Fire. Cal Fire IMT 1 (Waterman). Mendocino County, CA. Timber and grass. Moderate runs and torching. Numerous residences threatened. Greenfield, and Orr Springs threatened. Evacuations in effect.

Whiskeytown Complex (3 fires), Whiskeytown National Recreation Area, NPS. Twelve miles west of Redding, CA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire activity with upslope runs. Commercial property, communication infrastructure and power lines threatened.

American River Complex (3 fires), Tahoe NF. Eleven miles northeast of Foresthill, CA. Timber, brush and chaparral. Backing and surface fire. Power lines and cultural resources threatened.

Yuba River Complex (28 fires), Tahoe NF. IMT 1 (Summerfelt) and IMT 2 (Joseph). Thirteen miles northeast of Nevada City, CA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs. Residences, hydroelectric facilities and power lines threatened. Road closures in effect.

Iron Complex (27 fires), Shasta-Trinity NF. IMT 2 (Swartzlander). One mile north of Junction City, CA. Heavy timber, brush and grass. Moderate rates of spread with uphill runs. Numerous structures threatened.

Lime Complex (53 fires), Shasta-Trinity NF. IMT 1 (Opliger) and IMT 2 (Kaage). Fourteen miles west of Hayfork, CA. Timber. Short duration crown runs, single and group tree torching and short-range spotting. Numerous residences and structures threatened. Evacuations in effect.

Walker, Sonoma-Lake Napa Unit, Cal Fire. Cal Fire IMT 1 (Morris). Ten miles northeast of Clearlake Oaks, CA. Chaparral. Active torching and spotting. Residences threatened.

Mill, Lassen NF. Sixteen miles northeast of Los Molinos, CA. Timber. Burning in wilderness area.

Antelope, Lassen NF. Seven miles southeast of Paynes Creek, CA. Timber. No further information received.

Peterson, Lassen NF. IMT 1 (Ruggiero). IMT will also manage the Popcorn fire. Twelve miles east of Cassell, CA. Timber and grass. Community of Little Valley threatened. No further information received.

Popcorn, Lassen-Modoc Unit, Cal Fire. Nine miles northwest of Little Valley, CA. Timber, brush and grass. Spotting. Community of Little Valley threatened. Voluntary evacuations in effect.

Corral, Lassen-Modoc Unit, Cal Fire. Twenty-three miles west of Termo, CA. Timber and grass. Moderate rates of spread.

LNF June Lightning Complex, Lassen NF. Sixteen miles southwest of Chester, CA. Timber. Smoke impacting area communities. No further information received.

Cub Complex (4 fires), Lassen NF. IMT 2 (Batten). Sixteen miles southwest of Chester, CA. Timber. Short uphill runs with short range spotting. Smoke impacting communities.

Humboldt Complex, Humboldt-Del Norte Unit, Cal Fire. Humboldt County, CA. Timber, slash and grass. Isolated spotting. Numerous residences threatened.

Canyon Complex (34 fires), Plumas NF. IMT 1 (Pincha-Tulley). Sixteen miles northeast of Paradise, CA. Timber. Moderate rates of spread and isolated torching. Residences and archeological sites threatened. Road closures in effect.

Soda Complex, Mendocino NF. IMT 2 (Heintz). Fifteen miles northwest of Upper Lake, CA. Chaparral and oak woodlands. Backing fire with torching. Residences threatened.

June ABCD Misc Complex (2 fires), Mendocino NF. Twenty-four miles southwest of Chico, CA. Chaparral, timber and grass. Backing fire with short runs and torching. Residences and structures threatened.

TGU Lightning Complex (3 fires), Tehama-Glenn Unit, Cal Fire. Tehama County, CA. Chaparral. Moderate rates of spread.

Siskiyou Complex (5 fires), Klamath NF. IMT 2 (Paul). Eighteen miles southwest of Happy Camp, CA. Conifer and hardwood overstory with heavy timber litter. Active fire behavior with short uphill runs. Historical and cultural resources threatened.

Mad Complex (4 fires), Six Rivers NF. Humboldt County, CA. Timber, brush and grass. Active fire behavior. Residences threatened.

Ukonom Complex (6 fires), Six Rivers NF. IMT 2 (Lund). IMT is also managing the Blue fire. Ten miles east of Orleans, CA. Timber. Active fire behavior. Structures threatened.

Gould, Klamath NF. Etna, CA. Timber. Rapid rates of spread.

Blue, Six Rivers NF. Twelve miles northeast of Klamath, CA. Heavy timber and brush. Ground fire.

Hell's Half Complex (2 fires), Six Rivers NF. Eight miles southwest of Burnt Ranch, CA. Timber. Uphill runs and short range spotting. Structures threatened.

Basin Complex (2 fires), Los Padres NF. IMT 1 (Dietrich). Five miles southeast of Big Sur, CA. Timber, brush and slash. Active burning at higher elevations with short crown runs, torching and spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations in effect. Highway 1 closed.

Clover, Sequoia NF. IMT 2 (Johnson and Harvey). Thirty-two miles north of Weldon, CA. Timber and brush. Medium range spotting. Residences threatened.

Distillery, Coronado NF. IMT 2 (Small). Ten miles east of Vail, AZ. Timber and grass. Backing with isolated torching. Residences, archeological sites and power lines threatened.

White Tank, Coronado NF. IMT 2 (Sciacca). Ten miles east of Arivaca, AZ. Short grass and mesquite. No further information received.

Fire Not Scouted and Sized Up

Watchout Situation #1 comes up during initial attack and every time resources arrive at a fire.

● Before taking action on the fire, the following considerations must be addressed:

- Can you personally observe the fire or must you use scouts? Describe ways you can scout and size up a fire.
- Do you know the location of the fire perimeter? Discuss situations in which the fire perimeter may not be obvious. (Spotty fires, etc.)
- Do you know the direction of fire spread? When isn't the direction of fire spread obvious? (Wind shifts, spotty fires, etc.)
- Does the direction of fire spread increase risk? Talk about situations where you may have to approach the head of the fire. (Hiking down from a helispot, approaching from an existing road, switching winds, etc.)
- Do you know the fuels and their condition? What kind of information will you assume from what you already know about fuel types? (Spot fires in fir, extreme fire potential in flashy fuels, etc.)

● To reduce the risks:

- Post lookouts until the fire is sized up and escape routes and safety zones are established.
- Retreat if the situation is too complex. Review fires where you had to wait until the area in which you were assigned to work was scouted and sized up before you were allowed onto the fireline.
