2009 Winter Initial Attack, Texas Forest Service. Texas IMT 2 (Bennett). IMT is supporting multiple fires in west Texas. Acres reported are a cumulative total.

Peach Orchard, Osage Agency, BIA. Four miles north of New Prue, OK. Hardwood litter and grass. Active fire behavior. Structures threatened.

Juniper Springs, National Forests in Florida. Nine miles east of Silver Springs, FL. Southern rough and downed heavy fuels. Minimal fire activity.

Pretty Penny, Osage Agency, BIA. One mile southwest of Okesa, OK. Hardwood litter and grass. Creeping and smoldering.

Adel, Osage Agency, BIA. One mile northeast of Adel, OK. Hardwood litter and grass. Minimal fire activity.

Woody, Florida DOF. Previously reported. Nine miles north of Deltona, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire activity.

Greenwood, Texas Forest Service. Started on private land ten miles east of Midland, TX. Grass. Moderate fire activity.

Border Road, Florida DOF. Eight miles northeast of Venice, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire activity.

Brewster CMD, Florida DOF. Two miles west of Fort Meade, FL. Grass. Moderate fire activity.

Old Fifty, Florida DOF. One mile southwest of Richloam, FL. Brush. Moderate fire activity.

Indian Lake, DOF. Three miles west of Daytona Beach, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire activity.

Matanzas, Florida DOF. Three miles southwest of St. Augustine, FL. Southern rough. Active fire behavior. Residences threatened.

The Boot, Oklahoma DOF. Eight miles southwest of Keys, OK. Hardwood litter. Minimal fire activity.

Stone Mountain, Cherokee NF. Three miles east of Unicoi, TN. Hardwood litter. Active fire behavior.
