Wrangler, Kisatchie NF. Twenty miles southwest of Natchitoches, LA. Southern rough, pine and hardwood. Isolated interior burning.

Bombing Range Nine 21, National Forests in Florida. Eleven miles west of Astor, FL. Timber and brush. Smoldering.

* **Sheppard**, Florida DOF. Thirty-five miles west of Orlando, FL. Southern rough. Active fire behavior.

* **Salt Lick Creek**, Kentucky DOF. Started on private land ten miles north of Albany, KY. Timber and logging slash. Ground fire.

* **Gordon Branch**, Kentucky DOF. Started on private land eight miles south of Edmonton, KY. Timber and logging slash. Active fire behavior. Residences threatened.

Lucky Hollow, George Washington and Jefferson NF. Fourteen miles northeast of Harrisonburg, VA. Timber. No new information.

Fish Trap, Daniel Boone NF. Nine miles northwest of Campton, KY. Hardwood litter. No new information.

McGill, Osage Agency, BIA. Four miles southwest of Barnsdall, OK. Timber. No new information.

Toothman, Osage Agency, BIA. Three miles northeast of Prue, OK. Timber. No new information.
