Rock House, Texas Forest Service. Fort Davis, TX. Grass. Active fire behavior. Residences threatened.

Roper, Texas forest Service. One mile northeast of Alpine, TX. Grass. Active fire behavior. Residences threatened. Evacuations in effect.

Swenson, Texas Forest Service. Three miles north of Swenson, TX. Brush and grass. Minimal fire activity.

Killough, Texas Forest Service. Six miles north of Post, TX. Mesquite and grass. Minimal fire activity.

Hickman, Texas Forest Service. Started on private land in Midland, TX. Grass. Minimal fire activity.

Encino, Texas Forest Service. Thirteen miles west of San Angelo, TX. Grass. Active fire behavior. Residences threatened.

* **Cannon**, Texas Forest Service. Fifty miles east of Fort Stockton. Grass. Active fire behavior.

Cooper Mountain Ranch, Texas Forest Service. Fifteen miles northeast of Sterling City, TX. Grass. Active fire behavior. Residences threatened. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

* **Indiahoma Wye**, Wichita Mountains NWR. IMT2 (Dueitt). Seven miles northeast of Indiahoma, OK. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior. Residences threatened. Evacuations in effect.

Elim Church Rd., Georgia Forestry Commission. One mile northeast of Ludiwici, GA. Southern rough. Minimal fire activity. Residences threatened.

Camp Bowie, Texas Forest Service. Started on private land six miles southeast of Brownwood, TX. Oak, cedar and grass. Minimal fire activity.

Wildcat, Texas Forest Service. Nineteen miles southwest of Bronte, TX. Grass. Moderate fire activity.

* **Schoelzzow**, Texas Forest Service. Twenty-two miles west of Kerrville, TX. Grass. Moderate fire activity.

* **Lucas**, Texas Forest Service. Eleven miles southeast of Breckenridge, TX. Grass. Active fire behavior.

* **Wildlife Trail**, Oklahoma DOF. Eight miles northeast of Stringtown, OK. Timber. No further information received.

Predictive Services Discussion: Strong winds with low relative humidity will occur over the eastern plains of New Mexico and the Texas Panhandle northward into southern Nebraska. Cool weather with scattered showers and a few thunderstorms are expected over the Great Basin. Widespread showers and thunderstorms will persist from the Mid-Atlantic states and the Southeast while wet weather continues over New England.

POWER LINE SAFETY

Operating near or under power lines poses unique hazards, and the following precautions should be followed to reduce potential equipment damage or injury:

- If possible, the power company should deactivate lines in the fire area.
- Don't operate heavy equipment under power lines.
- Keep all aviation activity away from power lines. Inform air attack and/or other aviation resources of the location of the power lines.
- Don't drive with long antennas under power lines.
- Don't stand near power lines during retardant drops.
- Don't park under power lines. The magnetic field around energized power lines can induce an electrical charge in ungrounded vehicles or equipment. This charge can shock anyone who touches the vehicle.
- Don't apply straight stream to power lines.
- All personnel should be cautioned that smoke may become charged and conduct the electrical current. Deactivated transmission and distribution lines may continue to pose a hazard due to induction.
- If power lines fall on your vehicle, DON'T leave the vehicle until the power company arrives. If the vehicle is on fire or fire is near, jump clear, don't hang on, keep feet together, and bunny hop away.
