Predictive Services Discussion: Critical to very critical fire weather will stretch from southeast New Mexico to east-central Texas on Tuesday. The most extreme conditions will center over west-central Texas, where southwest to west winds of 25-35 to 45-50 mph will combine with relative humidity dropping to near 10%. The National Weather Service has issued Red Flag Warnings for a large portion of western Texas, valid from late morning through early evening Tuesday. Further east across the southern tier of the nation, there will be higher humidity and a better chance of rain or showers.
