Mills Canyon, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. IMT 1 (Lewis). Two miles southwest of Entiat, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Creeping and smoldering with isolated torching and short-range spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Moccasin Hill, Klamath Unit, Oregon DOF. IMT 2 (Cline). Four miles north of Sprague River, OR. Timber and brush. Running with short-range spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations have been lifted.

* **Buzzard**, Burns District, BLM. IMT 2 (Watts). Thirteen miles northwest of Riverside, OR. Juniper, brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior. Structures threatened.

* **Saddle Draw**, Vale District, BLM. Nineteen miles southeast of Crane, OR. Grass. Extreme fire behavior. Residences threatened.

* **Waterman Complex**, John Day Unit, Oregon DOF. IMT 2 (Johnson) Twenty miles northeast of Mitchell, OR. Timber. Running, torching and spotting. Structures threatened. Road closures in effect.

* **Twin Reservoir**, Burns District, BLM. Seven miles north of Princeton, OR. Juniper, brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior. Structures threatened.

* **Lamb Ranch**, Burns District, BLM. Fifteen miles northwest of Riverside, OR. Juniper and grass. Extreme fire behavior.

* **Jack Knife**, Prineville District, BLM. Nine miles southwest of Shaniko, OR. Juniper and grass. Structures threatened. No further information received.

White River, The Dalles Unit, Oregon DOF. IMT 2 (Buckman). Fifteen miles west of Maupin, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened.

* **Bridge 99 Complex**, Deschutes NF. IMT 2 (Fillis). Eighteen miles north of Sisters, OR. No further information received.

LOOKOUTS (LCES)

Operational Engagement Category

Lookouts are often better situated to notice the cumulative changes of fire behavior.

- Fire Order #5 says “Post lookouts when there is possible danger.” Should you utilize lookouts at all times?
 - Lookouts should be posted at all times.
- What are you looking for when you are selecting a lookout location?
 - Choose a good vantage point, preferably with a good overview of the entire area where firefighters are located, including escape routes and safety zones.
 - Never rely exclusively on aircraft as your lookout.
- What are the desired qualities, capabilities, knowledge, and responsibilities of a lookout person?
 - Experienced firefighter.
 - Solid knowledge of fire behavior and ability to recognize and monitor other environmental hazards.
 - Knowledge of crew locations, escape and safety locations and trigger points.
 - Good communicator--keeps the crew advised of fire behavior changes, tracks weather trends and relays the information, informs crew of work progress and updates from the latest strategy and tactical briefings.
 - Monitors and accounts for all individuals within his/her assigned area at all times, and will notify others if breaks are needed.
- What is the necessary equipment for a lookout?
 - PPE, radio with extra batteries, compass, binoculars, belt weather kit, IAP, map, food, water and watch.
