**Tanana Area Fires (9 fires)**, Tanana Zone, BLM. IMT 2 (Staats). Started on native corporation land seven miles northeast of Tanana, AK. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with group torching. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations in effect.

**Middle Yukon Fires (4 fires)**, Galena Zone, BLM. IMT 2 (Hutton). Started on native corporation land two miles north of Nulato, AK. Timber, brush and short grass. Active fire behavior with isolated torching, flanking and backing. Numerous structures threatened.

**Rock**, Tanana Zone, BLM. Started on native corporation land nine miles southeast of Hughes, AK. Timber. Active fire behavior with torching and backing. Structures threatened.

**Chahalie Lake**, Upper Yukon Zone, BLM. Started on native corporation land 10 miles northeast of Chalkyitsik, AK. Timber. Active fire behavior with crowning, running and smoldering.

**Baker**, Tanana Zone, BLM. Previously reported incident. Started on state land four miles southwest of Eureka, AK. Closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, backing and creeping. Structures threatened. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Rex Complex (2 fires)**, Fairbanks Area Forestry, DOF. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (Sheldon) back to the local unit will occur today. Started on private land seven miles southeast of Clear, AK. Timber, brush and tall grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

**Aggie Creek**, Fairbanks Area Forestry, DOF. IMT 2 (Rosenthal) and IMT 2 (Nieto). Thirty miles northwest of Fairbanks, AK. Timber. Active fire behavior with torching and spotting. Structures threatened. Area closures in effect.

**Healy Lake**, Delta Area Forestry, DOF. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (Bentley) back to the local unit will occur today. IMT is also managing the Michigan Creek fire. Started on native corporation land 28 miles southeast of Delta Junction, AK. Timber. No new information. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

**Michigan Creek**, Delta Area Forestry, DOF. Thirty-eight miles northeast of Delta Junction, AK. Timber. No new information. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

**Anaconda Creek**, Fairbanks Area Forestry, DOF. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (Allen) back to the local unit will occur today. Twenty-four miles northeast of Fairbanks, AK. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Numerous structures threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

**Long Lake**, Tok Area Forestry, DOF. Started on BIA land two miles east of Northway, AK. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching and flanking.

**Tetlin Hills**, Tok Area Forestry, DOF. Eight miles southeast of Tok, AK. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing and creeping.

**Nenana Ridge**, Fairbanks Area Forestry, DOF. Twelve miles east of Four Mile Rd, AK. Light logging slash. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

**Sockeye**, Mat-Su Area Forestry, DOF. Started on private land six miles north of Willow, AK. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

\* **Yukon Creek**, Galena Zone, BLM. Started on FWS land 21 miles east of Kaltag, AK. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with group torching, backing and creeping. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

\* **Bare Mt**, Galena Zone, BLM. Started on state land 35 miles west of Poorman, AK. Hardwood litter. Moderate fire behavior. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

\* **Ungalik**, Galena Zone, BLM. Ninety-seven miles east of Koyuk, AK. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with single tree torching and creeping. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

\* **Munsatli 2**, Tanana Zone, BLM. Started on state land 28 miles southwest of Lake Minchumina, AK. Closed timber litter, brush and short grass. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, short-range spotting and running. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

**Lloyd**, Tanana Zone, BLM. Previously reported incident. Started on state land 35 miles south of Tanana, AK. Timber. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Structures threatened. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

\* **Falco**, Galena Zone, BLM. Twenty-three miles northwest of Ruby, AK. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

\* **Shaktoolik**, Galena Zone, BLM. Forty-four miles southeast of Koyuk, AK. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing and creeping. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

\* **Fork**, Galena Zone, BLM. Started on state land 29 miles southwest of Ruby, AK. Hardwood litter. Moderate fire behavior. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

**Corner Creek**, Ochoco NF. ODF IMT 1 (Buckman) and IMT 2 (Fillis). IMT's are also managing the Sugar Loaf fire. Eleven miles south of Dayville, OR. Timber, brush and short grass. Active fire behavior with running and torching. Structures and sage-grouse habitat threatened. Road closures in effect.

**Sugar Loaf**, Prineville District, BLM. Nine miles north of Dayville, OR. Timber and short grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Structures threatened.

**231**, Northeast Region, DNR. IMT 2 (Ciraulo). Started on private land seven miles south of Springdale, WA. Timber, brush and tall grass. Active fire behavior with single tree torching, backing and creeping. Structures threatened.

**Twenty-One Mile Grade**, Colville Agency, BIA. IMT 2 (Leitch). Twenty-one miles south of Republic, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with single tree torching and backing. Structures threatened. Road and area closures in effect.

\* **Willow Springs**, Spokane District, BLM. Two miles north of Quincy, WA. Brush and short grass. Moderate fire behavior with group torching and short range spotting. Sage-grouse habitat threatened. Trail and area closures in effect.

**Horseshoe**, Gifford Pinchot NF. IMT2 (Gales). Fifteen miles northwest of Trout Lake, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with group torching and short-range spotting.

**Sleepy Hollow**, Southeast Region, DNR. One mile northwest of Monitor, WA. Short grass. No new information.

\* **Newby Lake**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. IMT 2 (Rabe). Eleven miles northwest of Loomis, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Trail closures in effect.

\* **Radar**, Burns District, BLM. One mile northwest of Hines OR. Brush and tall grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened.

\* **Beezley Hill**, Spokane District, BLM. Two miles north of Quincy, Washington. Brush and short grass. Moderate fire behavior with wind-driven runs. Structures and sage-grouse habitat threatened.

\* **Wolverine**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. Three miles northwest of Lucerne, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Numerous structures threatened.

**Williams**, Northeast Region, DNR. Three miles north of Colville, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior. Numerous structures threatened. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Buckskin**, Rogue River-Siskiyou, NF. Ten miles southwest of Cave Junction, OR. Closed timber litter and brush. No new information. Last report unless new information is received.

**Predictive Services Discussion** Cooler, fall-like weather will spread southward to the central Rockies and central Plains as a strong Canadian cold front drops deeper into the U.S. Rain and thunderstorms will form along and ahead of a front from eastern Colorado to the upper Great Lakes region. Scattered thunderstorms will form over the Rockies and parts of the Great Basin as the upper ridge continues to weaken. Scattered afternoon thunderstorms will continue across the Southeast. Temperatures in the West will drop slightly with some warming beginning in the Pacific Northwest. The South will remain very warm while milder conditions continue in the Northeast.

In Alaska, high pressure will strengthen over the state, increasing temperatures and accelerating drying through the Interior. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop over the Southwest.


