Chimney Tops 2, Great Smoky Mountains NP. IMT 1 (Dueitt). IMT is also managing the Cobbly Knob fire. Five miles south of Gatlinburg, TN. Dormant brush, hardwood slash and hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, road, area and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

* **Cobbly Knob**, Tennessee DOF. IMT 1 (Dueitt). Ten miles east of Gatlinburg, Tennessee. Dormant brush, hardwood slash and hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area and trail closures in effect.

Rock Mountain, Chattahoochee-Oconee NF. IMT 2 (Bentley). Two miles south of Tate City, GA. Hardwood litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Road, area and trail closures in effect.

Lake Chinnabee, National Forests in Alabama. Three miles southeast of Munford, AL. Timber and hardwood litter. No new information.

Camp Branch, National Forests in North Carolina. Transfer of command from IMT 1 (Wilkins) back to local unit will occur today. Seven miles west of Franklin, NC. Hardwood litter, timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with isolated interior smoldering. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Pinnacle Mountain, South Carolina Forestry Commission. Three miles southeast of Rocky Bottom, SC. Hardwood litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Trail closures in effect.

Chestnut Knob, North Carolina Forest Service. Three miles south of Enola, NC. Hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened. Road, area and trail closures in effect.

Tatum Gulf, Georgia Forestry Commission. Eleven miles west of LaFayette, GA. Hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened. Road and area closures in effect.


Predictive Services Discussion: Santa Ana winds will continue to impact portions of Southern California creating critical fire weather conditions until late evening. Further east, an inflow of gulf moisture will lead to areas of moderate to heavy rainfall across portions of the South Central states that will spread northeast through the day. By late evening, drought starved areas across the Southeast could begin seeing another round of beneficial rainfall. Pockets of light snow are expected across New England as a front drops southeast into the region from Hudson Bay while the Pacific Northwest sees a stronger, snowy system moving into the Cascades and Northern Rockies.
