Umpqua North Complex, Umpqua NF. IMT 1 (T. Kurth). Fifty miles east of Roseburg, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, flanking and short-range spotting. Residences threatened. Evacuations, road, area and trail closures in effect.

Falcon Complex, Umpqua NF. IMT 2 (Johnson). Twenty-five miles east of Tiller, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Active fire behavior with flanking, isolated torching, and smoldering. Structures threatened. Road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Jones, Willamette NF. IMT 2 (Ciraulo). Ten miles northeast of Lowell, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with running, group torching and spotting. Structures threatened. Road, trail and area closures in effect.

Bridge Creek, Colville Agency, BIA. IMT 2 (Sheldon). Eleven miles northeast of Keller, WA. Timber, tall grass, and light logging slash. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching, backing and flanking. Road and area closures in effect.

High Cascades Complex (2 fires), Rogue River - Siskiyou NF. IMT 1 (von Tillow). Nine miles northeast of Prospect, OR. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and single-tree torching. Structures threatened. Road, trail and area closures in effect.

Whitewater, Willamette NF. IMT 1 (Schulte). Ten miles east of Idanha, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with backing, creeping and isolated torching. Structures threatened. Road, trail and area closures in effect.

Jolly Mountain, Okanogan - Wenatchee NF. IMT 2 (Sinclair). Thirteen miles northwest of Cle Elum, WA. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with backing and isolated torching. Structures threatened. Trail and area closures in effect.

Nena Springs, Warm Springs Agency, BIA. IMT 2 (Harrod). Seven miles northeast of Simnasho, OR. Timber and short grass. Minimal fire behavior. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Noisy Creek, Colville NF. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (Rabe) back to the local unit will occur today. Six miles southeast of Metaline Falls, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and single-tree torching. Residences threatened. Road, trail and area closures in effect.

Indian Creek, Mt. Hood NF. Transfer of command from NIMO (Quesinberry) back to the local unit will occur today. Six miles south of Cascade Locks, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Trail and area closures in effect.

Chetco Bar, Rogue River - Siskiyou NF. NIMO (Houseman). Sixteen miles west of Selma, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking and backing. Road and trail closures in effect.

Flounce, Medford District, BLM. Transfer of command from ODF IMT 1 (Hessel) back to the local unit will occur today. Started on state land 12 miles northwest of Shady Cove, OR. Timber, brush and tall grass. Minimal fire behavior.

Bear Butte, Wallowa - Whitman NF. Twenty miles northwest of Baker City, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened. Road and area closures in effect.

Diamond Creek, Okanogan - Wenatchee NF. IMT 2 (Andrews). Twenty-five miles north of Winthrop, WA. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with group torching, backing and flanking. Structures threatened. Road, trail and area closures in effect.

Milli, Deschutes NF. IMT 1 (Pierson) Nine miles west of Sisters, OR. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with spotting and group torching. Road, trail and area closures in effect.

Whychus, Ochoco NF. Ten miles northeast of Sisters, OR. Brush and tall grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Road and area closures in effect.

East Saddle, Mid-Columbia National Wildlife Refuge Complex. Ten miles west of Othello, WA. Brush and short grass. Minimal fire behavior.

Shan Creek, Rogue River-Siskiyou NF. IMT 2 (Greer). Ten miles west of Grants Pass, OR. Medium logging slash, timber and grass. Active fire behavior with single-tree torching, flanking and backing. Structures threatened. Road closures in effect.

Hult Butte, Washington State. Started on private land twenty miles northwest of Boardman, WA. Brush and tall grass. No new information.

* **North Pole**, Prineville District, BLM. Started on private land eight miles east of Shaninko, OR. Short grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

* **Three Sisters Central**, Willamette NF. Thirty miles west of Bend, OR. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with spotting and group torching. Trail and area closures in effect. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

* **Miller Complex** (2 fires), Rogue River - Siskiyou NF. Seventeen miles east of Cave Junction, OR. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with group torching, flanking and backing. Structures threatened.

Area Command Team (Stutler) is managing large fires on the Lolo National Forest and Flathead Reservation.

Rice Ridge, Lolo NF. IMT 2 (Goldman). Six miles north of Seeley Lake, MT. Timber. Active fire behavior with creeping, torching and short crown runs. Structures threatened. Road, trail and area closures in effect.

Lolo Peak, Lolo NF. Transfer of command from IMT 1 (Livingston) to IMT 1 (Poncin) will occur tomorrow. Ten miles southwest of Lolo, MT. Timber. Active fire behavior with backing, uphill runs and group torching. Residences threatened. Evacuations, road, trail and area closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Sunrise, Lolo NF. Transfer of command from IMT 1 (Turman) to IMT 1 (Lund) will occur on 8/19. IMT is also managing the Burdette fire. Eleven miles east of Superior, MT. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with group torching, short-range spotting and backing. Structures threatened. Road, trail and area closures in effect.

Burdette, Lolo NF. Thirteen miles southeast of Tarkio, MT. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

Gibraltar Ridge, Kootenai NF. IMT 2 (Connell). Seven miles east of Eureka, MT. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened. Road, trail and area closures in effect.

Sapphire Complex (3 fires), Lolo NF. IMT 2 (Pearson). Fifteen miles southeast of Clinton, MT. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with group and isolated torching and spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations, road, trail and area closures in effect.

Meyers, Beaverhead - Deerlodge NF. IMT 2 (Esperance). Twenty-five miles southwest of Philipsburg, MT. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and single-tree torching. Structures threatened. Evacuations, road and area closures in effect.

Hanover, Nez Perce - Clearwater NF. Transfer of command IMT 2 (Leach) to IMT 2 (Bales) will occur tomorrow. Four miles northeast of Florence, ID. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with uphill runs and long-range spotting. Structures threatened. Road, trail and area closures in effect.

Tamarack, Northwestern Land Office, Montana DNR. IMT 2 (Hutton). Started on Forest Service land twenty-two miles northwest of Marion, MT. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with single-tree torching, backing and creeping.

Liberty, Flathead Agency, BIA. IMT 2 (Rohrer). Seventeen miles southeast of Arlee, MT. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, group and isolated torching. Structures threatened. Trail and area closures in effect.

Park Creek, Helena - Lewis and Clark NF. IMT 2 (Zombro). IMT is also managing the Arrastra Creek fire. Two miles north of Lincoln, MT. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with backing and creeping. Trail closures in effect.

Arrastra Creek, Helena - Lewis and Clark NF. Six miles northwest of Lincoln, MT. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with backing and creeping. Structures threatened. Area closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion: A breezy, dry westerly flow will continue across the northwestern portion of the CONUS as the previous days' cold front moves east toward the Great Lakes by afternoon, producing scattered storms over Minnesota. A weak trough of low pressure will remain located along the Californian Coast, but should remain mostly dry and will produce a weak off shore flow. The monsoonal flow over the southwest will be weaker than previous days, but still present over New Mexico and Colorado. Scattered showers and storms will remain possible along a stalled frontal boundary that remains in place across the Southeast. The Northeast will remain warm and dry under a weak ridge of high pressure.

Developing a Learning Organization
Leadership Category

Leaders evaluate performance at all levels to understand the causal factors of successes and failures. All those involved learn incrementally, applying today's lessons to the next assignment. This focus on continuous improvement brings with it a responsibility to share lessons learned throughout the organization.

In a learning organization, leaders treat honest mistakes as opportunities to learn and do better next time. Understanding that failure is a part of learning, they establish command climates in which followers are motivated by desire to succeed rather than fear of failure. At the crew level, conducting regular After Action Reviews is one of the most powerful tools a leader has for building effective and cohesive teams.

Discussion Points

- Discuss the relationship between developing a learning organization and safety.
- What happens when honest mistakes are punished rather than used as a learning opportunity?
- How are mistakes and failure dealt with within your crew / organization?
- What was your crew's / organization's most recent learning moment?
