Area Command Team (Jalbert) has been mobilized to support wildland fire in Colorado.

**Cameron Peak**, Arapaho and Roosevelt NF and Pawnee National Grassland, USFS. IMT 1 (RM Team 1). Fifteen miles southwest of Redfeather Lakes, CO. Timber. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, wind-driven runs and flanking. Several communities threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Calwood**, Boulder County. Ten miles northwest of Boulder, CO. IMT 2 (RM Team Black). IMT is also managing the Lefthand fire. Timber, brush and short grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and isolated torching. Several communities threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Lefthand**, Arapaho and Roosevelt NF and Pawnee National Grassland, USFS. One mile east of Ward, CO. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**East Troublesome**, Medicine Bow-Routt NF and Thunder Basin National Grassland, USFS. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (NR Team 6) to IMT 1 (PNW Team 3) will occur tomorrow. IMT is also managing the Williams Fork fire. Seventeen miles northeast of Kremmling, CO. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with group torching and long-range spotting. Numerous structures, infrastructure and sage-grouse habitat threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Williams Fork**, Arapaho and Roosevelt NF and Pawnee National Grassland, USFS. Fifteen miles southwest of Fraser, CO. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with single tree torching, short-range spotting and creeping. Several communities and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Ice**, San Juan NF, USFS. Five miles west of Silverton, CO. Timber and short grass. Moderate fire behavior with single tree torching, spotting and backing. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Mullen**, Medicine Bow-Routt NF and Thunder Basin National Grassland, USFS. IMT 1 (SA Blue Team). Thirty-eight miles west of Laramie, WY. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with isolated torching, creeping and smoldering. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Middle Fork**, Medicine Bow-Routt NF and Thunder Basin National Grassland, USFS. Ten miles north of Steamboat Springs, CO. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and isolated torching. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**August Complex** (2 fires), Mendocino NF, USFS. Area Command Team (Stutler), IMT 1 (GB Team 1) and IMT 1 (SW Team 1). Fourteen miles northwest of Elk Creek, CA. Timber, chaparral and tall grass. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Slater**, Klamath NF, USFS. IMT 2 (NW Team 7). IMT is also managing the Devil fire. Five miles northeast of Happy Camp, CA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Several communities and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Evacuations have been lifted.

**Devil**, Klamath NF, USFS. Five miles north of Seiad, CA. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area and trail closures in effect.

**Red Salmon Complex**, Six Rivers NF, USFS. IMT 2 (CA Team 12). Fourteen miles northeast of Willow Creek, CA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Several communities threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**North Complex**, Plumas NF, USFS. IMT 2 (CA Team 11). One mile southwest of Crescent Mills, CA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, backing and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Fork**, Eldorado NF, USFS. Fifteen miles northeast of Pollock Pines, CA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous structures and infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Area Command Team (Sexton) has been mobilized to support planning operations in California.

**Creek**, Sierra NF, USFS. IMT 1 (CA Team 1). Thirty-five miles northeast of Clovis, CA. Timber, chaparral and tall grass. Active fire behavior with torching, backing and creeping. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**SQF Complex**, Sequoia NF, USFS. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (CA Team 13) to IMT 2 (EA Gold Team) will occur tomorrow. Thirty-three miles east of Porterville, CA. Timber and chaparral. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Dolan**, Los Padres NF, USFS. IMT 2 (EA Silver Team). IMT is also managing Coleman fire. Ten miles south of Big Sur, CA. Brush, chaparral and short grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Coleman**, Los Padres NF, USFS. Thirteen miles southwest of King City, CA. Brush and tall grass. Active fire behavior with running and flanking. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closure in effect.

**Bobcat**, Angeles NF, USFS. Twelve miles northeast of Pasadena, CA. Chaparral, brush and tall grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous structures and infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Predictive Services Discussion:** An upper-level trough will move through the Pacific Northwest and Northern Rockies helping to slide stronger flow to the south over the Intermountain West. A cold front will continue moving through the Pacific Northwest and into the Great Basin with a cold front reinforced in the Northern Rockies and northern Plains. Dry and windy conditions will develop across portions of the Great Basin, central Rockies, and Southwest. Gusty offshore, northerly winds will continue through this morning and likely start again overnight across portions of northern California. Snow is expected across the Northern Rockies and onto the northern Plains with precipitation extending into the Upper Midwest and Great Lakes as a cold front pushes south and warm front lifts to the north.

## Helicopter Landing Area Safety

*Aviation Category*

The following points should be considered when operating around an unimproved landing site:

- Always wear your personal protective equipment (PPE) when working around an operating helicopter. (Eye, hearing, head.)
- Always get the approval of a flight crewmember or the pilot before approaching an operating helicopter.
- Only approach and depart a helicopter as directed, in a slightly crouched position. Do not run. Keep in pilot's field of vision at all times.
- Never go near the tail of helicopters.
- When loading helicopters in uneven terrain, always approach and depart from the downslope (lower) side and do not hold equipment overhead.
- Remove or secure loose articles prior to working around an operating helicopter.
- Do not reach up or chase after loose objects.
- Be aware of the dust abatement conditions of the landing area, as blowing dust, sand, or rocks caused by the helicopter's rotor wash can be hazardous.
