Smith River Complex (8 fires), Six Rivers NF, USFS. IMT 2 (CA Team 15) and IMT 2 (NW Team 13). Seven miles northeast of Gasquet, CA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, torching and backing. Several communities, energy and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Happy Camp Complex (11 fires), Klamath NF, USFS. IMT 1 (CA Team 5). Twenty-one miles west of Yreka, CA. Timber and heavy slash. Minimal fire behavior with flanking, backing and smoldering. Several communities, energy and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, road and trail closures in effect.

2023 SRF Lightning Complex (6 fires), Six Rivers NF, USFS. IMT 1 (CA Team 2). Twenty-two miles north of Hoopa, CA. Timber, brush and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with short-range spotting, flanking and backing. Several communities, energy and communication infrastructure threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

South Fork Complex (2 fires), Shasta-Trinity NF, USFS. IMT 2 (CA Team 11). Fifteen miles west of Hayfork, CA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with creeping, flanking and short-range spotting. Communities of Hyampom and Lake Mountain Ranch, energy and communication infrastructure threatened. Area closure in effect.

Deep, Shasta-Trinity NF, USFS. IMT 2 (CA Team 10). Ten miles north of Weaverville, CA. Timber, closed timber litter and chaparral. Active fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

SKU August Lightning Complex, Siskiyou Unit, Cal Fire. Two miles south of Yreka, CA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Energy infrastructure threatened.

Lahaina, County of Maui. One mile northeast of Lahaina, HI. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior. Numerous structures threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Upcountry, County of Maui. Eight miles northeast of Wailea, HI. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior. Numerous residences threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Gray, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. IMT 2 (NW Team 7). Three miles southwest of Medical Lake, WA. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Several communities and railroad infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Oregon, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. IMT 1 (NW Team 3). Two miles northeast of Elk, WA. Timber, grass and brush. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, torching and long-range spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Moderate fire behavior with flanking, single tree torching and short-range spotting. Community of McKenzie Bridge, energy and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bedrock, Willamette NF, USFS. IMT 1 (NW Team 2). Twelve miles south of Vida, OR. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations have been lifted. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sourdough, North Cascades NP, NPS. IMT 2 (NW Team 8). Six miles northeast of Newhalem, WA. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with single tree torching, flanking and short-range spotting. Community of Diablo and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Flat, Rogue River-Siskiyou NF, USFS. IMT 2 (SW Team 3). Two miles southeast of Agness, OR. Brush, timber and hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Huckleberry Flats, Mt. Baker-Snoqualmie NF, USFS. Nine miles east of Darrington, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and torching. Structures threatened. Road closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Hot, dry, and breezy conditions will continue across the southern and central Plains, Lower Mississippi Valley, into Florida, Mid/Upper Mississippi Valley, and portions of the Southeast, with widespread very hot, well above normal temperatures across much of the central US and Southeast. Lingering dry and breezy conditions are also likely in portions of the Southwest, but thunderstorm coverage will likely increase as monsoonal moisture slowly increases over the region. Scattered to widespread thunderstorms will stretch from south Texas through the Four Corners states, with isolated to scattered thunderstorms and showers from northern California through much of the Inland Northwest, Idaho, Montana, and Wyoming. Showers are likely to move into portions of western Washington as well, but much of western Oregon, central Washington, and northwest California are likely to remain dry, with breezy Cascade Gap winds likely. Breezy winds and lowering relative humidity will develop from southern California through much of Nevada. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue in the Great Lakes. Showers and below normal temperatures are likely across the northern half of Alaska with warmer and drier conditions across the southern half.
