Predictive Services Discussion:

Dry and windy conditions will continue from northern Minnesota through the Great Lakes into the Northeast leading to elevated and locally critical conditions, with high-risk significant fire potential forecast across New England, eastern New York, northern New Jersey, and northern Minnesota. Isolated to scattered thunderstorms will develop across much of the Intermountain West and High Plains, with the greatest coverage in portions of the Southwest and northern Rockies. Scattered to widespread thunderstorms are expected from the Lower Mississippi Valley to the South Carolina and Georgia coasts. Severe thunderstorms will be most likely in the central High Plains and portions of the Southeast. In Alaska, rain and snow showers will gradually diminish on the west coast and southwest Interior with near normal temperatures and dry conditions for the eastern half of the state.
