Anvil, Rogue River-Siskiyou NF, USFS. IMT 2 (GB Team 4). IMT 1 (SW Team 1) mobilizing. IMT is also managing the Flat fire. Eight miles east of Port Orford, OR. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and backing. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Flat, Rogue River-Siskiyou NF, USFS. Two miles southeast of Agness, OR. Timber, brush and hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Morgan, Fremont-Winema NF, USFS. IMT 2 (NW Team 7). Nineteen miles east of Bly, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Lookout, Willamette NF, USFS. IMT 1 (NW Team 2). IMT is also managing the Petes Lake and Bedrock fires. Thirty miles west of Sisters, OR. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Petes Lake, Willamette NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles west of Bend, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

Bedrock, Willamette NF, USFS. Twelve miles south of Vida, OR. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Chilcoot, Umpqua NF, USFS. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (NW Team 6) to IMT 2 (NW Team 13) will occur tomorrow. IMT is also managing the Grizzly, Brice Creek, and Dinner fires. Twenty miles northeast of Glide, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grizzly, Umpqua NF, USFS. Eleven miles southwest of Oakridge, OR. Timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Brice Creek, Umpqua NF, USFS. Eight miles southwest of Oakridge, OR. Timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with isolated torching. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Dinner, Umpqua NF, USFS. Eight miles southwest of Oakridge, OR. Timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

Cowlitz Complex (2 fires), Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (CA Team 13) back to the local unit will occur tomorrow. Nine miles east of Randle, WA. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Road and trail closures in effect.

Camp Creek, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Ten miles northeast of Sandy, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Water infrastructure threatened. Area closures in effect.

Tyee Ridge Complex (2 fires), Central Unit, Oregon DOF. Ten miles west of Sutherlin, OR. Timber, medium slash and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Above normal temperatures and dry conditions are expected across the Intermountain West with near normal temperatures in much of California due to onshore flow. Breezy southwesterly sustained winds 12-25 mph with gusts 25-40 mph amid relative humidity of 10-20% will create areas of elevated conditions across northwest Nevada into southeast Oregon and southwest Idaho. Rain will become more widespread west of the Cascades from far northwest California into western Washington. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop along and ahead of a cold front in the Mississippi Valley and much of Oklahoma and Texas. The heaviest and most widespread rain is forecast from the ArkLaTex into central Texas with severe thunderstorms likely as well. Rain will continue across much of the Mid-Atlantic into southern New England due to the remnants of Ophelia, while scattered thunderstorms develop over the Florida Peninsula.
