Predictive Services Discussion:

Above normal temperatures will continue across California into the northern Intermountain West, with record high temperatures possible across portions of the northern Great Basin. Minimum relative humidity will fall to 5-20% across these areas as well, with single digits most common across the central and northern Great Basin, where poor overnight recover below 30% is expected. Scattered wet thunderstorms are forecast across the Southwest, with more isolated thunderstorms into eastern Utah and the Colorado Rockies. Hot temperatures are expected across the Ohio Valley to the Mid-Atlantic, where record high temperatures are possible. Locally elevated conditions are possible in New Jersey, where southwesterly winds of 10-15 mph will develop in the afternoon. Showers and thunderstorms will develop across the Great Lakes eastward to New England, while scattered thunderstorms develop in south Georgia and Florida. Above normal temperatures are likely across much of the southern two-thirds of Alaska, with isolated thunderstorms in the western Interior and breezy north winds creating elevated to critical conditions for the Copper Basin and Susitna Valley.
