# **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Widespread southwest winds of 25-45 mph with gusts 45-65 mph amid relative humidity of 5-15% will develop from southeast Arizona into much of New Mexico into the High Plains of Colorado, Kansas, Oklahoma and Texas creating critical to extremely critical conditions. Strong low pressure will develop over western Kansas and move into lowa tonight, with strong to severe thunderstorms developing ahead of the dryline from eastern Nebraska south into central Texas. To the north of the storm, widespread precipitation is expected across Nebraska, the Dakotas, and Upper Midwest, with heavy snow and areas of blizzard conditions in the eastern Dakotas to northern Minnesota. Precipitation will gradually wind down in the northern half of the West, but heavy snow is likely to continue into the afternoon across the northern and central Rockies. Drier weather is expected to return to the Southeast and much of the East Coast. Near to above normal temperatures are expected in Alaska, with scattered snow showers across the Seward Peninsula into much of the Interior.
