**Bear Gulch**, Olympic NF, USFS. Transfer of command from NIMO to CIMT (NW Team 7) will occur tomorrow. NIMO is also managing the Hamma incident. Ten miles northwest of Hoodport, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, running and flanking. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Hamma**, South Puget Sound Region, Washington DNR. Four miles northwest of Hamma Hamma, WA. Timber and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Burdoin**, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 13). Five miles west of Lyle, WA. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and backing. Communities of Lyle and High Prairie, energy and railroad infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Pomas**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 10). Thirty-six miles northwest of Entiat, WA. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping, and isolated torching. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Rock Creek**, Vale District, BLM. Twelve miles southwest of Jordan Valley, OR. Brush and grass. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs and smoldering. Structures and sage-grouse habitat threatened. Evacuations in effect.

**Hope**, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Started on private land 15 miles north of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

\* **Stud Horse**, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Two miles east of Winthrop, WA. Brush, grass and timber. Active fire behavior with crowning, wind-driven runs and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, road and trail closures in effect.

\* **Lake Creek**, Pendleton Unit, Oregon DOF. Nine miles southeast of Pilot Rock, OR. Grass, timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

Extreme fire behavior with short crown runs, torching and long-range spotting. Numerous structures, communication and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Billy**, Tonto NF, USFS. Fifteen miles south of Young, AZ. Brush, medium slash and timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, uphill runs and backing. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Several communities, energy and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Sage-grouse habitat threatened.

**Mill**, Idaho Falls District, BLM. Four miles south of Patterson, ID. Brush, grass and timber. Active fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and single tree torching. Structures and sage-grouse habitat threatened.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms are possible across eastern/central Oregon and Washington, and western Idaho at first, with storms increasing and extending into northern California, western Montana, and the northern Great Basin during the afternoon. A few storms may drift west of the Cascade Crest early in the morning.

Very dry conditions with minimum relative humidity of 4-15% and poor overnight recovery will continue across much of Utah and Nevada as well as inland southern California and southern Idaho. Elevated conditions will persist across southeast Nevada to western Utah with southwesterly winds of 15-25 mph with gusts of 30-40 mph.

Monsoon moisture lies over much of Arizona, New Mexico, and southeast Utah, extending east of the Divide where isolated to scattered wet thunderstorms are forecast. Isolated dry thunderstorms will remain possible on the western fringe of the moisture from western Arizona to the West Slope. Scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected across the Great Plains. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue in the Southeast, continuing to cool temperatures.
