Monroe Canyon, Fishlake NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 5). Three miles east of Monroe, UT. Brush, timber and heavy slash. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, flanking and torching. Several communities, energy and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Sage-grouse habitat threatened.

Jakes, Elko District, BLM. Two miles southwest of Midas, NV. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and backing. Community of Midas, communication infrastructure and sage-grouse habitat threatened.

MP 22, Elko District, BLM. Six miles southwest of Midas, NV. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences and sage-grouse habitat threatened.

Adobe Mountain, Elko District, BLM. Thirty-eight miles north of Elko, NV. Grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and backing. Structures and sage-grouse habitat threatened.

Deer Creek, Southeast Area, Utah DOF. One mile north of Old La Sal, UT. Chaparral, timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and isolated torching. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Mill, Idaho Falls District, BLM. Four miles south of Patterson, ID. Brush, grass and timber. No new information. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Active fire behavior with short crown runs, flanking and long-range spotting. Numerous structures, communication and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Middle Mesa, Carson NF, USFS. CIMT (SW Team 3). Twenty-two miles west of Dulce, NM. Timber, brush and medium slash. Active fire behavior with torching, spotting and flanking. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened.

Bronco, San Carlos Agency, BIA. Thirty miles northeast of San Carlos, AZ. Chaparral, brush and grass. Active fire behavior with torching, running and backing. Residences threatened. Area closure in effect.

Lee, White River Field Office, BLM. Eleven Miles southwest of Meeker, CO. Grass and brush. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, wind-driven and short crown runs. Community of Meeker and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Stoner Mesa**, San Juan NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles northeast of Cortez, CO. Timber. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, running and torching. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect.

* **Waters Canyon**, Ute Mountain Agency, BIA. Fourteen miles southwest of Mancos, CO. Timber and medium slash. Active fire behavior with flanking, torching and backing. Structures threatened.

Turner Gulch, Grand Junction Field Office, BLM. CIMT (NR Team 2). Eight miles northeast of Gateway, CO. Timber, brush and grass. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, uphill runs and crowning. Community of Gateway threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Leroux, Uncompahgre Field Office, BLM. Five miles north of Hotchkiss, CO. Brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching and creeping. Residences threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Sharp Canyon, Dolores County, CO. Twenty-five miles northwest of Cortez, CO. Brush, chaparral and timber. Extreme fire behavior with short crown runs, spotting and group torching. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Hot, dry, and breezy west-southwesterlies will remain in place across the Great Basin, into the West Slope and across the central Rockies, including areas of the Southwest. West-southwest winds of 15-30 mph with gusts 30-40 mph, minimum relative humidity of 3-12%, poor overnight recovery will develop. Elevated fire weather conditions are expected across most of those parts, with critical conditions across eastern Nevada, south/central Utah, and northwest Colorado.

Isolated dry thunderstorms with gusty, erratic winds are possible across the Southwest into the Central Rockies from northeast Arizona and northwest New Mexico into southwest Colorado. Rain will develop near/west of the Cascades in Washington, with mixed wet/dry thunderstorms are also possible across northern Washington, the Idaho Panhandle, and western Montana.

Monsoon moisture extends from eastern Arizona to the east of the Divide. Isolated to scattered wet thunderstorms are expected over most areas east of the Divide, including across the Great Plains and parts of the south and east.
