Community of Meeker threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Sage-grouse habitat threatened.

Lee, White River Field Office, BLM. Eleven Miles southwest of Meeker, CO. Grass and brush. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, short crown runs and wind-driven runs. Community of Meeker and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Turner Gulch, Grand Junction Field Office, BLM. CIMT (NR Team 2). Eight miles northeast of Gateway, CO. Timber, brush and grass. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, uphill runs and crowning. Community of Gateway threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Stoner Mesa, San Juan NF, USFS. Eleven miles northeast of Dolores, CO. Timber. Active fire behavior with group torching, short-range spotting and flanking. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Twelve, Moffat County, CO. Three miles northeast of Elk Springs, CO. Grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and isolated torching. Area and road closures in effect. Sage-grouse habitat threatened.

Waters Canyon, Ute Mountain Agency, BIA. Fourteen miles southwest of Mancos, CO. Timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and torching. Structures threatened. Road closures in effect.

Leroux, Uncompahgre Field Office, BLM. Five miles north of Hotchkiss, CO. Brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area and road closures in effect.

South Rim, Black Canyon of the Gunnison NP, NPS. Nine miles east of Montrose, CO. Brush, timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Sage-grouse habitat threatened.

Beulah, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 4) mobilizing. Thirty-two miles northeast of Kamas, UT. Timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs and group torching. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, flanking and long-range spotting. Numerous structures, communication and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bronco, San Carlos Agency, BIA. Thirty miles northeast of San Carlos, AZ. Timber, chaparral and brush. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, wind-driven runs and long-range spotting. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Middle Mesa, Carson NF, USFS. CIMT (SW Team 3). Twenty-two miles west of Dulce, NM. Brush, hardwood litter and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, creeping and single tree torching. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened.

Cumulative acres shown in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Winds overall on Saturday will be lighter than they have been for much of the week, but westerly winds of 12-25 mph with gusts 25-35 mph amid RH of 5-12% will persist from southern Nevada into the Greater Four Corners creating elevated conditions. Lighter winds, but still dry conditions are expected across the rest of the Great Basin into the central Rockies Hot, above normal temperatures and low RH will spread across most of California away from the coast with RH of 5-15% and poor overnight recovery, but winds will be light except in areas favored by terrain. Small areas of localized stronger winds are expected across southwest Oregon. A slight increase in monsoon moisture is expected near and south of the Mogollon Rim into southwest New Mexico, with isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms but a better chance of wetting rain than previous days. However, isolated dry thunderstorms and new ignitions remain possible in northern Arizona and New Mexico.

Temperatures will rebound to near normal in the Northwest and northern Rockies amid minimum RH of 12-25% and light winds. Hot, dry, and breezy conditions will continue for the southern Plains ahead of a cold front, with elevated conditions most likely in North Texas and central/western Oklahoma. Scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected in the Midwest and much of Florida, with more isolated thunderstorms into the Southeast. Dry conditions are expected in the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic, with minimum RH of 25-40%.
