Predictive Services Discussion:

Across the Greater Four Corners area, winds continue to ease a little today with west to northwesterly winds of 5-20 mph with gusts of 20-30 mph amid RH of 5-15% and poor overnight recovery. Across the remainder of the Great Basin and into the Central Rockies, winds will be a little lighter, but conditions are still expected to be dry.

For most of California and southwestern Oregon away from the coast, hot, above normal temperatures and low RH continue, with RH of 5-15% and poor overnight recovery. Winds will be mostly light except in areas favored by terrain.

Above normal temperatures build in the Pacific Northwest, with minimum RH of 10-20% away from the coast, and modest overnight recovery. Light winds are expected except in areas favored by terrain.

A slight increase in monsoon moisture is expected near and south of the Mogollon Rim and into New Mexico and the Central Rockies, bringing a chance of isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms with gusty outflows - isolated dry thunderstorms and new ignitions remain possible in northern Arizona and New Mexico.

Dry, and breezy conditions will continue for parts of Texas, with moderate conditions persisting. Scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected across remaining parts of the Plains, as well as parts of the Midwest and the Southeast. Warm and dry conditions are expected in the Northeast, with minimum RH of 25-40%.
