**Elk RBX**, Rio Blanco County, CO. CIMT (RM Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Lee incident. Ten miles southeast of Meeker, CO. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Community of Meeker and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Sage-grouse habitat threatened. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Lee**, White River Field Office, BLM. CIMT (NR Team 1) mobilizing. Eleven miles southwest of Meeker, CO. Grass and brush. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, wind-driven runs and short-range spotting. Community of Meeker and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Crosho**, Medicine Bow-Routt NF, USFS. Eight miles northwest of Yampa, CO. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with short crown runs and long-range spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Stoner Mesa**, San Juan NF, USFS. CIMT (RM Team 1). Eleven miles northeast of Dolores, CO. Timber and brush. Extreme fire behavior with uphill runs, torching and spotting. Community of Rico threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

**Turner Gulch**, Grand Junction Field Office, BLM. Transfer of command from CIMT (NR Team 2) to CIMT (NR Team 3) will occur tomorrow. Eight miles northeast of Gateway, CO. Timber, brush and grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, wind-driven runs and group torching. Community of Gateway threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Spring Creek**, Washakie County, WY. Thirty miles east of Worland, WY. Timber. Active fire behavior with crowning, wind-driven runs and torching. Structures threatened.

\* **Red Canyon**, Wind River/Bighorn Basin District, BLM. Eleven miles east of Thermopolis, WY. Grass and brush. Extreme fire behavior with running, spotting and wind-driven runs. Structures threatened. Evacuations in effect.

\* **Sleeper Ranch**, Wind River/Bighorn Basin District, BLM. Twenty-six miles south of Cody, WY. Brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior with running, flanking and wind-driven runs. Structures threatened.

**South Rim**, Black Canyon of the Gunnison NP, NPS. Nine miles east of Montrose, CO. Brush, timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Waters Canyon**, Ute Mountain Agency, BIA. Fourteen miles southwest of Mancos, CO. Timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Structures threatened.

**Monroe Canyon**, Fishlake NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 2). Three miles east of Monroe City, UT. Brush, timber and heavy slash. Moderate fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and single tree torching. Numerous communities, energy and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

\* **Willard Peak**, Bear River Area, Utah DOF. One mile northeast of North Ogden, UT. Chaparral and grass. Active fire behavior with running, wind-driven runs and backing. Numerous structures, energy and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Beulah**, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 4). Thirty-two miles northeast of Kamas, UT. Timber. Active fire behavior with single tree torching, group torching and backing. Several communities threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Box**, Boise District, BLM. Fifty-six miles southwest of Grandview, ID. Grass and brush. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, group torching and running. Residences and communication infrastructure threatened.

**Jakes**, Elko District, BLM. Two miles southwest of Midas, NV. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Sage-grouse habitat threatened.

\* **Elkhorn**, Salmon-Challis NF, USFS. Forty-five miles east of Challis, ID. Timber. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, uphill runs and short-range spotting. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Temperatures across much of the West will be near to below normal, although temperatures in southern Montana will remain 5-10°F above normal. Widespread rain is expected with an atmospheric river near and west of the Cascades in Washington and northern Oregon, but a strong rain shadow is expected to keep wetting rain limited today east of the Cascade Crest. Breezy conditions will continue to the southeast across eastern Oregon into the central Great Basin and southwest Montana, with the strongest winds gusting to 35 mph amid relative humidity of 7-15% creating elevated conditions, most likely in the central Great Basin to southwest Montana. Monsoon moisture will be at its peak across the Southwest and Greater Four Corners with scattered, mainly wet thunderstorms. However, not all areas will receive wetting rain, and isolated mixed wet and dry thunderstorms remain possible on the northwest fringe from central Nevada into central Wyoming. Elsewhere, breezy and dry southerly winds are expected on portions of the southern Plains. Scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected across the Midwest, and across much of the Southeast. However, dry conditions will return to the Northeast, with very low relative humidity of 15-25% expected in Maine although winds will be light.
