**Cottonwood Peak**, Elko District, BLM. CIMT (EA Team 1). Three miles north of Tuscarora, NV. Brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, running and spotting. Community of Tuscarora, structures, energy infrastructure and sage-grouse habitat threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

**Rock**, Boise NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 6). Five miles southwest of Donnelly, ID. Closed timber litter, timber and brush. Active fire behavior with group torching, short-range spotting and short crown runs. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

#### **Predictive Services Discussion:**

A weak cold front will move through the northern Rockies bringing locally breezy westerly sustained winds of 12-25 mph gusting to 35 mph from the Cascade Gaps east into the northern Great Basin and northern Rockies. Hot, above normal temperatures will persist in the central and northern Rockies, spreading into more of the Great Basin and southern California amid relative humidity of 5-20% and poor overnight recovery. Isolated, mainly dry, thunderstorms are expected from far northeast Nevada into central Montana and western Wyoming. Monsoonal moisture extends into more of the Southwest across central Arizona and much of New Mexico. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms will persist in southeastern Arizona and New Mexico, but more mixed wet and dry thunderstorms are expected from central Arizona into southeast Utah, and near and east of the Divide in Colorado. Drier conditions are expected across the northern Plains and Midwest tomorrow, while isolated showers and thunderstorms develop across the southern Plains to the Southeast. A cold front will move through the Appalachians and Northeast with scattered showers and thunderstorms, but little to no rain is expected across northern New England. Hurricane Erin will bring strong winds, coastal flooding, and locally heavy rain to the North Carolina Outer Banks tonight.
