Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel have been deployed to Colorado Springs, CO and two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel have been deployed to Mesa, AZ to support wildland fire operations nationally. Their respective units are as follows: 302nd (Peterson SFB, CO) and 152nd AW (Reno, NV) to Colorado Springs, CO and 146th AW (Channel Islands, CA) and 153rd AW (Cheyenne, WY) to Mesa, AZ.

Six US Army HH-60 MEDEVAC Helicopters from the 1st Air Cavalry Brigade (Fort Hood, TX) have been deployed to California to support wildland fire operations nationally.

Red Canyon, Wind River/Bighorn Basin District, BLM. CIMT (RM Team 2). Eleven miles east of Thermopolis, WY. Grass, brush and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, running and flanking. Structures threatened. Evacuations, road and trail closures in effect.

Turner Gulch, Grand Junction Field Office, BLM. CIMT (NR Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Derby incident. Eight miles northeast of Gateway, CO. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Community of Gateway threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Derby**, White River NF, USFS. Thirteen miles north of Dotsero, CO. Grass and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and short-range spotting. Numerous structures threatened.

Crosho, Medicine Bow-Routt NF, USFS. Eight miles northwest of Yampa, CO. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching, creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Stoner Mesa, San Juan NF, USFS. CIMT (RM Team 1). Eleven miles northeast of Dolores, CO. Timber and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, torching and short-range spotting. Community of Rico threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Lee, White River Field Office, BLM. CIMT (NR Team 1). Eleven miles southwest of Meeker, CO. Grass, brush and chaparral. Moderate fire behavior. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Spring Creek, Washakie County, WY. Thirty miles east of Worland, WY. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and backing.

Bull Lake, Wind River Agency, BIA. Forty-two miles northwest of Riverton, WY. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and isolated torching.

Sleeper Ranch, Wind River/Bighorn Basin District, BLM. Twenty-six miles southeast of Cody, WY. Brush and grass. No new information. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Cottonwood Peak, Elko District, BLM. CIMT (EA Team 1). Three miles north of Tuscarora, NV. Brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, running and spotting. Community of Tuscarora and energy infrastructure threatened. Road and trail closures in effect. Sage-grouse habitat threatened

Rock, Boise NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 6). Five miles southwest of Donnelly, ID. Closed timber litter, timber and brush. Active fire behavior with group torching, short-range spotting and short crown runs. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Buckley Draw, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache NF, USFS. Three miles southeast of Provo, UT. Grass, chaparral and timber. Active fire behavior with single tree torching, flanking and backing. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Beulah, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 4). Thirty-two miles northeast of Kamas, UT. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with group torching, short-range spotting and uphill runs. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Monroe Canyon, Fishlake NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 2). Three miles east of Monroe City, UT. Brush, timber and heavy slash. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and torching. Several communities threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Box, Boise District, BLM. Fifty-six miles southwest of Grandview, ID. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with flanking and isolated torching. Residences threatened.

Chin Creek, Ely District, BLM. Fifty miles northeast of Ely, NV. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Sage-grouse habitat threatened.

Willard Peak, Bear River Area, Utah DOF. One mile northeast of North Ogden, UT. Chaparral and grass. Minimal fire behavior. Trail closures in effect.

Rancho, Truckee Meadows Fire Protection District. Ten miles north of Reno, NV. Grass and brush. No new information.

Bivens Creek, Beaverhead-Deerlodge NF, USFS. CIMT (NR Team 6). CIMT is also managing the Cloudrest incident. Fifteen miles north of Virginia City, MT. Timber. Active fire behavior with group torching, short-range spotting and short crown runs. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Horn, Madison County, MT. Seventeen miles northwest of West Yellowstone, MT. Brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Temperatures 5-20°F above normal will spread across California and extend east into the central Rockies. Temperatures near or above 100°F will occur in the lower elevations of California and Colorado, with above normal temperatures also spreading into the Northwest. Cooler, near normal temperatures are expected in the northern Rockies east of the Divide. Very low relative humidity of 5-20% and poor overnight recovery is expected in much of California, Great Basin, and central Rockies, expanding into the Inland Northwest. Monsoon over the Southwest will slowly spread into the Mojave Desert, eastern Nevada, and Utah. Isolated to scattered mixed wet and dry thunderstorms are expected on the periphery of the moisture surge from the Peninsular Ranges of southern California into central Nevada, most of Utah, the West Slope, and Wyoming. Scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected in Arizona, New Mexico, and east of the Divide in Colorado in the deeper moisture.

Elsewhere, isolated showers and thunderstorms will develop from Texas into the Southeast, with a cold front bringing scattered strong to severe thunderstorms to the northern Plains and Minnesota. Thunderstorms in South Florida may bring strong outflows to the ongoing fires. Dry conditions return to the Northeast with low relative humidity of 25-35% in northern New England amid light east winds. Stronger northeast winds will develop across Cape Cod overnight due to Hurricane Erin.
