#### **IMSR Map**

Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel have been deployed to Colorado Springs, CO and two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel have been deployed to Mesa, AZ to support wildland fire operations nationally. Their respective units are as follows: 302nd (Peterson SFB, CO) and 152nd AW (Reno, NV) to Colorado Springs, CO and 146th AW (Channel Islands, CA) and 153rd AW (Cheyenne, WY) to Mesa, AZ.

Six US Army HH-60 MEDEVAC Helicopters from the 1st Air Cavalry Brigade (Fort Hood, TX) have been deployed to California to support wildland fire operations nationally.

**Windy Rock**, Southwestern Land Office, Montana DNR. CIMT (NW Team 2). Fifteen miles northeast of Drummond, MT. Timber. Active fire behavior with crowning, running and long-range spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

**Corral Creek**, Lolo NF, USFS. Eighteen miles northwest of Missoula, MT. Timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and flanking. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Knowles**, Northwestern Land Office, Montana DNR. Started on private land 11 miles southeast of Plains, MT. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with single tree torching, short-range spotting and flanking. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations and area closures in effect.

**Sandbar 2,** Helena-Lewis and Clark NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 8). Thirteen miles northeast of Lincoln, MT. Closed timber litter and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with single tree torching and smoldering. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**West Fork**, Custer Gallatin NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles northwest of West Yellowstone, MT. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, short-range spotting and backing. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

#### **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Hot, dry, and unstable conditions prevail along much of the West Coast near and west of the Cascades and Sierra, and across the Pacific Northwest and western Montana, with temperatures 10-20°F above normal. Monsoonal moisture moving over the area will start to increase RH a little, however low RH of 10-20% is expected over the area. Overnight recovery will also be broadly improving, however still poor in parts. The thunderstorm risk continues to increase across the West Coast as and monsoonal moisture builds, with isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms likely around and near the Sierra as well as the Cascade ranges in Oregon and potentially Washington, providing a potential ignition source – gusty thunderstorm outflows are possible. High-risk significant fire potential is forecast for thunderstorms across northern California.

Higher monsoon moisture over the Southwest will bring scattered showers and thunderstorms to those parts, with moisture extending into the northern Great Basin and across the Central Rockies. Isolated to scattered mixed wet/dry thunderstorms expected across much of the central/southern Great Basin and across the Central Rockies - these thunderstorms will mostly bring wetting rain. However, dry and gusty thunderstorms remain a risk across the western and northern fringes of the moisture plume, with any lightning in these parts increase IA given how dry fuels are.

Elsewhere, isolated showers and thunderstorms will develop along the Gulf Coast and the east, extending to the Great Lakes area and into the central Great Plains. Across New England, RH increases to near 40% amid breezy south to southwest winds 15-20 mph and gusts to 35 mph elevated fire potential along the Maine coast.
