Their respective units are as follows: 302nd (Peterson SFB, CO) and 152nd AW (Reno, NV) to Boise, ID and 146th AW (Channel Islands, CA) and 153rd AW (Cheyenne, WY) to Mesa, AZ.

Six US Army HH-60 MEDEVAC Helicopters from the 1st Air Cavalry Brigade (Fort Hood, TX) have been deployed to California to support wildland fire operations nationally.

**Sunset**, Pend Oreille Area Office, Idaho Department of Lands. CIMT (NR Team 5). Twenty-six miles north of Coeur d'Alene, ID. Brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking and single tree torching. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Windy Rock**, Southwestern Land Office, Montana DNR. CIMT (NW Team 2). Fifteen miles northeast of Drummond, MT. Timber. Active fire behavior with crowning, running and long-range spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

**Bivens Creek**, Beaverhead-Deerlodge NF, USFS. CIMT (NR Team 6). CIMT is also managing the Cloudrest incident. Fifteen miles north of Virginia City, MT. Timber. Active fire behavior with group torching, short-range spotting and flanking. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Cloudrest**, Beaverhead-Deerlodge NF, USFS. Fifteen miles northwest of Virginia City, MT. Timber. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, long-range spotting and flanking. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**West Fork**, Custer Gallatin NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles northwest of West Yellowstone, MT. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, single tree torching and spotting. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Corral Creek**, Lolo NF, USFS. Eighteen miles northwest of Missoula, MT. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Knowles**, Northwestern Land Office, Montana DNR. Started on private land 11 miles southeast of Plains, MT. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations and area closures in effect.

**Ransome**, Kootenai NF, USFS. Eleven miles northwest of Libby, MT. Timber. Active fire behavior with running, single tree torching and short-range spotting. Residences threatened. Road closures in effect.

**Sandbar 2**, Helena-Lewis and Clark NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 8). Thirteen miles northeast of Lincoln, MT. Closed timber litter and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with single tree torching and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Lightning Creek**, Idaho Panhandle NF, USFS. Nine miles north of Clark Fork, ID. Heavy slash and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and backing. Road and trail closures in effect.

**Mile Marker 91**, Flathead Agency, BIA. Sixteen miles south of Hot Springs, MT. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, backing and smoldering. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Hot, dry, and unstable conditions will continue in Washington to the northern Rockies, with isolated mixed wet and dry thunderstorms possible in the afternoon in the Washington Cascades. Isolated mixed wet and dry thunderstorms may continue overnight in central Washington and far southwest Montana. Farther south, scattered mainly wet thunderstorms capable of locally heavy rain will develop from the Oregon Cascades, central Idaho, and Wyoming south to the Mexico border. However, areas of extensive morning and afternoon cloud cover will limit thunderstorm development and rainfall, most likely in Oregon, central Idaho, and Wyoming, while the most widespread thunderstorms and heavy rain are likely in Utah and western Colorado. In the eastern US, drier conditions will spread across much of the northern Plains to the Northeast outside of isolated showers downwind of the Great Lakes. Locally breezy northwesterly winds 10-18 mph with gusts to 25 mph will occur in New England but relative humidity is expected to remain near or above 35%. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue in Florida, with thunderstorms possible in western Kansas and Oklahoma, as well.
