Predictive Services Discussion:

Widespread showers and scattered thunderstorms are expected across southern and central Idaho into western Wyoming into far southwest Montana with localized flash flooding possible, with debris flows possible on recent burn scars. However, to the north across much of Washington and northern Idaho, thunderstorms will be more isolated and drier with several new ignitions likely, especially from any ongoing thunderstorms in eastern Washington during the morning. Monsoon moisture will continue to slowly wane in southern California and the Southwest with the drying trend spreading into the rest of California, the central and southern Great Basin, and West Slope. Isolated to locally scattered wet thunderstorms will develop in these areas but be less numerous than the past few days. Relative humidity will remain elevated, however, with minima above 25%, except in California where humidity could drop as low as 10%.

In the eastern US, a cold front is likely to move into the Upper Midwest with scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms, while the Northeast is likely to remain dry but with light winds. Dry conditions are also likely to continue from the Ohio Valley into the Southeast, with thunderstorms in Florida becoming more isolated and confined to the southern half of the state. More widespread thunderstorms are likely in Kansas and Oklahoma and spread into southwest Missouri overnight but miss most of Texas where thunderstorms will be isolated.
