Their respective units are as follows: 302nd (Peterson SFB, CO) and 152nd AW (Reno, NV) to Boise, ID and 146th AW (Channel Islands, CA) and 153rd AW (Cheyenne, WY) to Channel Islands, CA.

Six US Army HH-60 MEDEVAC Helicopters from the 1st Air Cavalry Brigade (Fort Hood, TX) have been deployed to California to support wildland fire operations nationally.

Sunset, Pend Oreille Area Office, Idaho Department of Lands. CIMT (NR Team 5). Twenty-six miles north of Coeur d'Alene, ID. Brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, single tree torching and smoldering. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Windy Rock, Southwestern Land Office, Montana DNR. CIMT (NW Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Devil Mountain incident. Fifteen miles northeast of Drummond, MT. Grass, timber and heavy slash. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, group torching and spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Devil Mountain, Southwestern Land Office, Montana DNR. Grass, timber and heavy slash. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, group torching and spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Bivens Creek, Beaverhead-Deerlodge NF, USFS. CIMT (NR Team 6). CIMT is also managing the Cloudrest incident. Fifteen miles north of Virginia City, MT. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Cloudrest, Beaverhead-Deerlodge NF, USFS. Fifteen miles northwest of Virginia City, MT. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Ransome, Kootenai NF, USFS. Eleven miles northwest of Libby, MT. Timber. Active fire behavior with single tree torching, running and uphill runs. Residences threatened. Road closures in effect.

Island Creek, Nez Perce-Clearwater NF, USFS. CIMT (NR Team 2) mobilizing. Fourteen miles east of Elk City, ID. Medium slash and timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, uphill runs and backing. Structures threatened. Road closures in effect.

Corral Creek, Lolo NF, USFS. Eighteen miles northwest of Missoula, MT. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

West Fork, Custer Gallatin NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles northwest of West Yellowstone, MT. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Knowles, Northwestern Land Office, Montana DNR. Started on private land 11 miles southeast of Plains, MT. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and backing. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations and area closures in effect.

Sandbar 2, Helena-Lewis and Clark NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 8) back to the local unit will occur today. Thirteen miles northeast of Lincoln, MT. Closed timber litter and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Lightning Creek, Idaho Panhandle NF, USFS. Nine miles north of Clark Fork, ID. Heavy slash and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and backing. Road and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Monsoon moisture is expected to spread across much of Washington into western Montana while continuing to slowly diminish farther south. Widespread showers with scattered thunderstorms are expected in portions of northern Idaho and extending into southwest Montana. The greatest threat for drier thunderstorms is across northern and western Washington, with wetter thunderstorms in Idaho and Montana. Farther south, as moisture decreases, isolated wet thunderstorms will develop across the Great Basin, Colorado, and New Mexico, but much of California and Arizona will be drier with few if any thunderstorms. Relative humidity will remain elevated, above 20% for most areas east of the Sierra, but will drop as low as 10% in California and fall into the teens east of the Cascades in Oregon.

In the eastern US, a cold front will move through Michigan and western New York with scattered showers and thunderstorms. Breezy and dry southwest winds with relative humidity as low as 30% will develop across New England and the Mid-Atlantic ahead of the front. Widespread wet thunderstorms will bring heavy rainfall from southwest Missouri to the Lower Mississippi Valley. However, thunderstorms in Texas will remain more isolated with South Texas remaining dry while scattered thunderstorms return to Florida.
