Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel have been deployed to Klamath Falls, OR and two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel have been deployed to Channel Islands, CA to support wildland fire operations nationally. Their respective units are as follows: 302nd (Peterson SFB, CO) and 152nd AW (Reno, NV) to Klamath Falls, OR and 146th AW (Channel Islands, CA) and 153rd AW (Cheyenne, WY) to Channel Islands, CA.

Six US Army HH-60 MEDEVAC Helicopters from the 1st Air Cavalry Brigade (Fort Hood, TX) have been deployed to California to support wildland fire operations nationally.

* **Blue**, Klamath NF, USFS. Ten miles east of Happy Camp, CA. Chaparral and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and short-range spotting.

Peak, Shasta Trinity NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 2). Nine miles southwest of Trinity Center, CA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and group torching. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bear Gulch, Olympic NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Hoodport, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Devil Mountain, Southwestern Land Office, Montana DNR. Grass, timber and heavy slash. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Bivens Creek, Beaverhead-Deerlodge NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 8). CIMT is also managing the Cloudrest incident. Fifteen miles north of Virginia City, MT. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Cloudrest, Beaverhead-Deerlodge NF, USFS. Fifteen miles northwest of Virginia City, MT. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sandbar 2, Helena-Lewis and Clark NF, USFS. Thirteen miles northeast of Lincoln, MT. Closed timber litter and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Warm and dry conditions persist across much of the western US with temperatures continuing to climb above normal in the western states, especially over the Inland Northwest and northern Idaho where highs could reach 103 degrees. Isolated mixed wet/dry storms will move into eastern Washington/northwest Montana tomorrow afternoon/evening for gusty outflow winds and possible new IA.

Showers and thunderstorms will develop again over the Central Plains, New Mexico, eastern Texas, and Florida while the rest of the Eastern US will be cool and dry with generally light winds.
