Burdoin, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 13). CIMT is also managing the Snyder Canyon incident. Five miles west of Lyle, WA. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and railroad infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Snyder Canyon, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. Three miles northwest of Klickitat, WA. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with backing and creeping. Structures threatened.

Lake Spokane, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 2). Started on private land 12 miles northwest of Spokane, WA. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Pomas, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 10). Thirty-six miles northwest of Entiat, WA. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bear Gulch, Olympic NF, USFS. NIMO. Ten miles northwest of Hoodspport, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hope, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Started on private land 15 miles north of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and backing. Residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagelstein, Klamath Unit, Oregon DOF. Four miles southeast of Modoc Point, OR. Timber, light slash and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area and road closures in effect.

Butte Creek, Warm Springs Agency, BIA. CIMT (NW Team 3). Five miles northeast of Simnasho, OR. Grass, timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

Board Shanty, Grants Pass Unit, Oregon DOF. One mile south of Grants Pass, OR. Timber and brush. No new information. Last report unless new information is received.

Dragon Bravo, Grand Canyon NP, NPS. Transfer of command from CIMT (SW Team 4) to CIMT (SW Team 2) will occur tomorrow. Two miles west of North Rim, AZ. Brush, timber and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, group torching and long-range spotting. Numerous structures, communication and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Laguna, Santa Fe NF, USFS. CIMT (SW Team 1). Eight miles north of Gallina, NM. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs and group torching. Residences threatened. Area closure in effect.

Billy, Tonto NF, USFS. Fifteen miles south of Young, AZ. Brush, slash and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area and trail closures in effect.

Cumulative acres shown in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Very dry conditions with minimum relative humidity of 3-10% with poor overnight recovery will persist across much of southern and eastern Nevada into eastern Idaho, Utah, Arizona, and the central/southern Rockies west of the Divide. Locally breezy southwesterly winds are also expected in portions of northern Arizona, eastern Utah, northwest Colorado, and southwest Wyoming creating areas of elevated conditions. Scattered mixed wet and dry thunderstorms will develop from northeast California into western Montana, with wetter storms east of the Divide in Montana. A few drier thunderstorms may continue overnight in eastern Oregon. Near to below normal temperatures will continue in much of central and southern California due to onshore flow. Hot temperatures will continue in the Southeast, but relative humidity is likely to remain above 35% with light winds. Dry conditions are likely to continue on the southern Plains, while scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected ahead of a cold front from the Midwest into the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic. Above normal temperatures will return to much of central and southern Alaska, with the driest conditions expected in the Yukon Flats.
