**Burdoin**, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 13). CIMT. Five miles west of Lyle, WA. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and railroad infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Lake Spokane**, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 2). Started on private land 12 miles northwest of Spokane, WA. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Pomas**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 10). Thirty-six miles northwest of Entiat, WA. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping, and isolated torching. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Bear Gulch**, Olympic NF, USFS. NIMO. Ten miles northwest of Hoodspport, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and backing. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Hope**, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Started on private land 15 miles north of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and backing. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Hagelstein**, Klamath Unit, Oregon DOF. Four miles southeast of Modoc Point, OR. Timber, light slash and brush. Minimal fire behavior. Area and road closures in effect.

\* **Little John**, Vale District, BLM. Eight miles west of Arock, OR. Brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, running and flanking. Sage-grouse habitat threatened.

**Dragon Bravo**, Grand Canyon NP, NPS. Transfer of command from CIMT (SW Team 4) to CIMT (SW Team 2) will occur today. Two miles west of North Rim, AZ. Brush, timber and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, group torching and long-range spotting. Numerous structures, communication and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Laguna**, Santa Fe NF, USFS. CIMT (SW Team 1). Eight miles north of Gallina, NM. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and torching. Structures threatened. Area closure in effect.

**Billy**, Tonto NF, USFS. Fifteen miles south of Young, AZ. Brush, slash and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area and trail closures in effect.

**Goose**, Gila NF, USFS. Eighteen miles northwest of Silver City, NM. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing and flanking. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Mammoth**, Modoc NF, USFS. Three miles north of Tionesta, CA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and isolated torching. Structures, energy, railroad infrastructure and sage-grouse habitat threatened. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

\* **Rim Road**, Southern Ute Agency, BIA. Eight miles southwest of Ignacio, CO. Timber, brush and grass. Active fire behavior with flanking, creeping and backing. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations in effect.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Very dry conditions with minimum relative humidity of 4-15% with poor overnight recovery will persist across much of central Nevada and southeast Idaho south and eastward through Utah into much of Wyoming, Colorado, Arizona, and northwest New Mexico. Locally elevated conditions will also develop in east-central Nevada to western Utah due to southwesterly sustained winds of 12-20 mph and gusts to 30 mph. Monsoon moisture will slowly work northwestward into southern and eastern New Mexico for isolated to scattered wet thunderstorms. However, isolated dry thunderstorms are possible on the northwestern fringe of the moisture in southeast Arizona to west-central New Mexico. Isolated to scattered mixed wet and dry thunderstorms will develop from northeast California into western Montana, with wetter storms east of the Divide in Montana. A few dry thunderstorms may develop after midnight in northwest Nevada, southeast Oregon, and southwest Idaho.

Near to below normal temperatures will continue in much of central and southern California due to onshore flow. Hot temperatures will continue in the Southeast, but relative humidity is likely to remain above 35% with light winds. Dry conditions will persist on the southern Plains, while scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected ahead of a cold front from the Midwest into the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic. In Alaska, above normal temperatures and dry conditions will persist in the Yukon Flats, but an Arctic cold front will bring cooler conditions to much of central and western Alaska.
