Nationally, there are eighteen fires being managed under a strategy other than full suppression. Fifteen fires are in Alaska. Three fires are in the Lower 48.

Burdoin, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 13). Five miles west of Lyle, WA. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and backing. Numerous structures, energy and railroad infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Lake Spokane, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 2) back to the local unit will occur tomorrow. Started on private land 12 miles northwest of Spokane, WA. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Pomas, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 10). Thirty-six miles northwest of Entiat, WA. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping, and isolated torching. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bear Gulch, Olympic NF, USFS. NIMO. NIMO is also managing the Hamma incident. Ten miles northwest of Hoodsport, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with crowning, flanking and backing. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hamma, South Puget Sound Region, Washington DNR. Four miles northwest of Hamma Hama, WA. Timber and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hope, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Started on private land 15 miles north of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Minimal fire behavior with single tree torching, creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Rock Creek**, Vale District, BLM. Twelve miles southwest of Jordan Valley, OR. Brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, running and flanking. Sage-grouse habitat threatened.

Hagelstein, Klamath Unit, Oregon DOF. Four miles southeast of Modoc Point, OR. Timber, light slash and brush. Minimal fire behavior. Area and road closures in effect. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect

Monroe Canyon, Fishlake NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 5). Three miles east of Monroe, UT. Brush, timber and heavy slash. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, flanking and spotting. Numerous structures, energy and communication infrastructure and sage-grouse habitat threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

White Sage, Arizona Strip District, BLM. Fifteen miles southeast of Fredonia, AZ. Timber, dormant brush and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and isolate torching. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Cumulative acres shown in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Very dry conditions with minimum relative humidity of 4-15% and poor overnight recovery will persist across much of central Nevada and southeast Idaho south and eastward through Utah into much of Arizona and portions of the West Slope. More widespread elevated conditions will develop in east-central Nevada to western Utah as southwesterly winds increase to 15-25 mph with gusts of 30-40 mph. Isolated, mainly dry, thunderstorms may be ongoing this morning from northeast California into central Oregon. Isolated to scattered mixed wet/dry thunderstorms are expected to cover a broader area, from northern California and the northern Great Basin into Oregon and Washington, and northern Rockies. Some storms will continue overnight in Oregon and possibly Washington, with a few storms drifting west of the Cascade Crest.

Monsoon moisture will continue its slow trek westward, reaching the Arizona/New Mexico border, southeast Arizona, and Colorado east of the Divide where isolated to scattered wet thunderstorms are forecast. Isolated dry thunderstorms will remain possible on the western fringe of the moisture from central Arizona to the West Slope. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop ahead of a cold front from the central Plains into the Great Lakes and Northeast, with some of the storms likely to be severe, particularly around Iowa. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue in the Southeast, continuing to cool temperatures, but above normal temperatures and dry conditions will continue on the central Plains. Cool and moist conditions are forecast for Alaska, while breezy and dry trade winds are expected in Hawai'i.
