Burdoin, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 13). Five miles west of Lyle, WA. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and backing. Communities of Lyle and High Prairie, energy and railroad infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Pomas, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 10). Thirty-six miles northwest of Entiat, WA. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping, and isolated torching. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bear Gulch, Olympic NF, USFS. NIMO. CIMT (NW Team 7) mobilizing. NIMO is also managing the Hamma incident. Ten miles northwest of Hoodspert, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, running and torching. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hamma, South Puget Sound Region, Washington DNR. Four miles northwest of Hamma Hama, WA. Timber and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Rock Creek, Vale District, BLM. Twelve miles southwest of Jordan Valley, OR. Brush and grass. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, running and flanking. Structures and sage-grouse habitat threatened.

Hope, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Started on private land 15 miles north of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, backing and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Lost Tom**, Vale District, BLM. Three miles west of Huntington, OR. Brush and grass. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs. Residences threatened.

Dragon Bravo, Grand Canyon NP, NPS. CIMT (SW Team 2). Two miles west of North Rim, AZ. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Extreme fire behavior with short crown runs, torching and long-range spotting. Numerous structures, communication and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Billy, Tonto NF, USFS. Fifteen miles south of Young, AZ. Brush, medium slash and timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, uphill runs and backing. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Cumulative acres shown in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Isolated mixed wet/dry, thunderstorms are likely across northeast California and central and eastern Oregon at first, with storms increasing and extending into Washington, western Montana, and the northern Great Basin during the afternoon, with a few storms possibly drifting west of the Cascade Crest. Storms across the Pacific Northwest and eastern Montana may continue overnight. Scattered mainly wet thunderstorms are expected across the Rockies extending into southeast Arizona, associated with the monsoon. In the Central Great basin, very dry conditions will persist with minimum relative humidity of 4-15% and poor overnight recovery will continue across much of Utah as well as southern Nevada, California and Idaho. Elevated conditions persisting across east-central Nevada to western Utah with southwesterly winds of 15-25 mph with gusts of 30-40 mph.

Monsoon moisture lies over much of Arizona and New Mexico, extending east of the Divide where isolated to scattered wet thunderstorms are forecast. Isolated dry thunderstorms will remain possible on the western fringe of the moisture from central Arizona to the West Slope. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop ahead of a cold front from the central Plains into the Great Lakes and Northeast, with heavier rain across the Ohio Valley. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue in the Southeast, continuing to cool temperatures, but above normal temperatures and dry conditions will continue on the central Plains.

Across Alaska, isolated wet scattered showers across the south. Warmer and drier conditions will build across the state late this week into the weekend, focused on the Interior. Widespread high temperatures in the 70s are expected with RH generally near or above 30%. Low pressure in the Gulf of Alaska is likely to keep south-central Alaska and the panhandle cooler with a chance of showers this weekend.
