Predictive Services Discussion:

Locally breezy north winds will continue in the Sacramento Valley of California and across the northern Great Basin, with minimum relative humidity as low as 10%. Temperatures will remain above normal in California but will be a few degrees below normal in the northern Intermountain West. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop across southeast California into the Four Corners today, with more isolated thunderstorm east of the Divide in Colorado and New Mexico. A cold front will move through the central and southern Plains and Midwest with showers and thunderstorms, with thunderstorms most likely to be severe in the Plains. Drier conditions will continue across the Appalachians and East Coast today, but scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue to bring locally heavy rain to the southern half of Florida. Locally breezy southerly winds will occur in the southern Interior off the Alaska Range, with showers continuing in southern Alaska and a few showers will spread into the Interior, as well.
