#### **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Isolated to scattered thunderstorm activity continues over the Northern Rockies and to a lesser degree in the central Idaho mountains and western Wyoming. Scattered showers are also expected over the Central to Northern Great Plains and upper Midwest as well as much of the Southeastern United States. Afternoon thunderstorm activity is also likely to develop in the central Rocky Mountains south into western New Mexico. Temperatures will reach up to 10 degrees above normal across much of the Great Basin, as well in Southern California and Southern Arizona where temperatures will exceed 100° F and relative humidity may reach 10% in the low elevations. Strong westerly flow will create downslope flow along the lee of the Sierra and the Cascades, creating elevated fire weather conditions in those areas in the afternoon. In Alaska, a widespread warming and drying trend will continue across the mainland, with gusty southerly winds forecast for the far western part of the state.
