Cumulative acres showing in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Hot and dry conditions will continue across much of the West today, with temperatures reaching above 110°F in the lower elevations of the Southwest and the Great Basin. Well above normal temperatures are also expected into the central Rocky Mountains and Great Plains. Strong southwesterly flow will overspread central California and into the Great Basin and northern Arizona by this afternoon. Sustained wind speeds of 25 MPH are forecast, with gusts up to 50 MPH possible, leading to elevated fire weather conditions, with some areas reaching critical levels. Temperatures in the Pacific Northwest, west of the Cascades, will be near normal or a few degrees below and there is a chance for scattered showers. Isolated to scattered thunderstorms and showers may also impact the central Idaho Mountains and into the Northern Rockies. A cold front moving across the Great Lakes Region and into the Atlantic Coast States will bring scattered showers to the Eastern United States with severe thunderstorms possible over the Middle Atlantic and into New England. Alaska is expecting another day of hot and dry conditions with high temperatures in the 80s and even 90s in portions of the Interior and low relative humidity in the 20s. A mix of wet and dry scattered thunderstorms are expected from the Alaksa Range north through the North Slopes.
