#### **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Near normal temperatures will return to the Pacific Northwest and the lower elevations of northern California while above normal temperatures will continue to dominate the weather in the eastern US. The highest temperatures today will be focused over the Middle Atlantic States and Great Lakes, while temperatures across the High Plains and much of the Intermountain west will remain 5 – 10°F below normal. The very strong winds experienced over the Four-Corners over the weekend have diminished slightly, but breezy conditions persist over southern Nevada and much of the Four-Corners area with 15-20 mph sustained southwesterly winds expected, gusting to 30 mph. Relative humidity will be in the teens over most of the area, contributing to elevated fire weather conditions. Gulf moisture over west Texas, New Mexico and the Plains will form scattered showers and thunderstorms with areas of heavy rain and possible flash flooding. Severe thunderstorms may occur along a cold front extending from the Central Great Plains into the Great Lakes. Alaska will experience another warm day, although high temperatures will be a few degrees cooler than in recent days. Thunderstorms are expected over the eastern Interior with wetting rain and breezy conditions.
