**Himalaya Road**, Fairbanks Area, Alaska DOF. CIMT (SW Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Aggie Creek incident. Started on Alaska DNR land 12 miles northwest of Fox, AK. Chaparral and timber. Moderate fire behavior with single torching, short-range spotting and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

**Aggie Creek**, Fairbanks Area, Alaska DOF. Started on Alaska DNR land 23 miles northwest of Fairbanks, AK. Chaparral and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

**Bear Creek**, Fairbanks Area, Alaska DOF. CIMT (AK Team 1). CIMT is also managing the Saint George Creek incident. Started on Alaska Native Corporation land 14 miles northwest of Healy, AK. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Structures threatened. Evacuations in effect.

**Saint George Creek**, Fairbanks Area, Alaska, DOF. Includes the acreage from the previously reported Bonnifield Creek fire. Started on Alaska DNR land 30 miles southwest of Salcha, AK. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Structures threatened.

\* **Roundabout Complex** (4), Galena Zone, BLM. Includes the acreage from the previously reported Richards and Caribou fires. Started on FWS land 8 miles southwest of Huslia, AK. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Ptarmigan Complex** (5 fires), Upper Ukon Zone, BLM. Five miles northwest of Central, AK. Brush, timber and hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous residences threatened.

**Seven Mile Lookout**, Tok Area, Alaska DOF. Started on Alaska DNR land seven miles southwest of Tok, AK. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Residences threatened. Evacuations in effect.

**Oskawalik**, Southwest Area, Alaska DOF. Nine miles south of Crooked Creek, AK. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Residences threatened.

\* **Meadow Creek**, Southwest Area, Alaska DOF. Started on Alaska DNR land 54 miles northwest of Nikolai, AK. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

\* **Susulatna Hills**, Southwest Area, Alaska DOF. Started on Alaska DNR land 48 miles northeast of McGrath, AK. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

\* **Susulatna**, Southwest Area, Alaska DOF. Started on Alaska DNR land 59 miles northwest of Nikolai, AK. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

\* **Elephant**, Tanana Zone, BLM. Started on Alaska DNR land twenty miles south of Rampart, AK. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structure threatened. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

\* **Michigan**, Tanana Zone, BLM. Twenty-two miles west of Wiseman, AK. Brush. Active fire behavior. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

\* **Orum**, Tanana Zone, BLM. Started on Alaska DNR land 30 miles southwest of Rampart, AK. Brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing and smoldering. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Above normal temperatures are expected across the northwestern US today. Locally breezy sustained winds of 12-20 mph with gusts to 30 mph amid minimum relative humidity of 10-25% will develop through the Cascade Gaps into the Columbia Basin and northern Sierra Front creating elevated conditions. Very dry conditions with minimum relative humidity of 5-12% and poor overnight recovery below 30% will continue in much of the southern/eastern Great Basin, Arizona, and West Slope, but winds will be light. Abundant monsoon moisture will continue across New Mexico with scattered to widespread showers and thunderstorms, extending into the Colorado Front Range.

Hot, record setting temperatures near 100°F will continue in the Mid-Atlantic, but a cold front will move through the Northeast today bringing cooler temperatures and scattered showers and thunderstorms. This cold front will also bring scattered showers and thunderstorms to the Great Lakes and northern Plains as it extends westward. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will also develop in much of the Southeast, including Florida. Another day of near to below normal temperatures are expected in Alaska along with scattered showers.
