\* **Acorn**, Osage Agency, BIA. Six miles south of Hominy, OK. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, running and torching. Residences threatened.

**Covington Drive**, South Carolina Forestry Commission. CIMT (FL State Team 1). Two miles west of Myrtle Beach, SC. Southern rough and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Numerous residences threatened.

\* **Walker Draught Street**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Started on private land one mile west of White Oak, GA. Hardwood litter and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and backing. Structures threatened.

\* **Eagle Bluff**, Oklahoma DOF. Five miles northeast of Grandview, OK. Timber. Active fire behavior. Residences threatened.

\* **Gray Squirrel Hollow**, Oklahoma DOF. Fourteen miles northeast of Tahlequah, OK. Hardwood litter. Moderate fire behavior.

\* **Scraper Hollow Creek**, Oklahoma DOF. Five miles northwest of Maryetta, OK. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Residences threatened.

\* **Slickfoot**, Oklahoma DOF. Two miles west of Colcord, OK. Light slash. Active fire behavior.

**East Parkway**, Tennessee DOF. Two miles southeast of Laurel, TN. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping.

\* **Ocean Front**, Texas A&M Forest Service. Started on Private land 15 miles south of Port Lavaca, TX. Grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

**Maker**, Osage Agency, BIA. One mile north of Blackburn, OK. Hardwood litter. No new information.

**Kenwood 15**, Tahlequah Field Office, BIA. Three miles northeast of Kenwood, OK. Timber. No new information.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

An upper-level trough will move through the southern Plains today bringing strong westerly winds of 20-40 mph with gusts to 65 mph to southeast New Mexico into central Texas, with the strongest winds in southeast New Mexico and far West Texas. Minimum relative humidity will fall to 5-15% amid well above normal temperatures creating widespread critical conditions. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop ahead of the trough across the Lower Mississippi Valley, as well. Widespread low afternoon relative humidity of 15-30% is expected from the Appalachians to the East Coast. Winds overall will be light, but southwesterly winds of 10-15 mph and temperatures 10 to 20 degrees above normal in the southern Appalachians and Southeast will create locally elevated conditions. A strong storm will move into the West Coast with widespread precipitation into the western Great Basin and northern Rockies as snow levels will fall to 3,000 to 4,000 feet tonight. The heaviest precipitation will fall in California, with heavy snow in the mountains. Localized flooding and debris flows are also possible, especially in southern California near recent burn scars. Near to below normal temperatures are expected in Alaska, with a few light snow showers in the southeast Interior and along the southeast coast. Strong trade winds are forecast across Hawai'i today, along with drier conditions and only a few windward showers.
