Table Rock Complex (3 fires), South Carolina Forestry Commission. CIMT (SA Team 2). Four miles northeast of Sunset, SC. Timber, hardwood litter and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, running, and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect.

Black Cove, North Carolina Forest Service. CIMT (NC State Team 1). IMT is also managing the Deep Woods fire. Five miles northeast of Saluda, NC. Hardwood litter, light slash and timber. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and running. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Deep Woods, North Carolina Forest Service. Four miles northeast of Saluda, NC. Hardwood litter, timber and light slash. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and running. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Alarka #5, North Carolina Forest Service. Five miles south of Bryson City, NC. Hardwood litter and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, smoldering and spotting. Numerous residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Road closures in effect.

Big Ridge, Chattahoochee-Oconee NF, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 3). Eight miles northeast of Clayton, GA. Harwood litter and timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and smoldering. Community of Sky Valley and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Rattlesnake Branch, North Carolina Forest Service. CIMT (SA Team 1). Eleven miles southeast of Waynesville, NC. Hardwood litter and brush. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, backing and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

- * **West Canaveral**, Florida Forest Service. Two miles west of Canaveral Groves, FL. Grass and southern rough. Active fire behavior with backing and wind-driven runs.
- * **Regina**, Kentucky DOF. Started on private land three miles north of Elkhorn City, KY. Hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with running and flanking. Residences threatened.

Tolliver, Virginia DOF. Previously reported as Brown Mountain Road. Seven miles north of Raven, VA. Timber and hardwood litter. Moderate fire behavior. Residences threatened.

Crusoe Island Road, North Carolina Forest Service. Twelve miles east of Williams, NC. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

* **Ga 57**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Nine miles northwest of Swainsboro, GA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, creeping and running.

Happy Hill Road, Oklahoma DOF. Eight miles southeast of McAlester, OK. Timber and hardwood litter. No new information.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Breezy southerly sustained winds of 10-25 mph, with higher gusts, will continue from the Appalachians to the East Coast, but relative humidity will be much higher and above 40%. A strong storm will move from the Mid-Mississippi Valley into southern Ontario bringing widespread precipitation from the Mississippi River to the Appalachians. Severe thunderstorms will develop across much of the Lower/Mid-Mississippi, Ohio, and Tennessee Valleys into the southeastern Great Lakes. A Pacific storm will move into the northern half of the West, with moderate valley rain and areas of heavy mountain snow, especially in the southern Cascades and northern Sierra. Breezy westerly winds will combine with relative humidity of 12-20% to create elevated fire weather conditions, mainly east of the Divide, while very low relative humidity below 15% is forecast across West Texas, but winds will be lighter. Light land and sea breezes are forecast in Hawai'i, with an increase in showers possible for Kauai. Near to slightly above normal temperatures are expected in Alaska, with light mixed precipitation for the west coast into the western Interior.
