Predictive Services Discussion:

Very warm, well above normal temperatures will continue in the Upper Midwest and eastern Dakotas today, breezy south to southeast winds of 12-20 mph are also expected in these areas. While minimum relative humidity will be higher than previous days at 20-30%, areas of elevated fire weather conditions are expected. Strong and dry southwesterly winds will continue in southeast Arizona into much of New Mexico and the southern High Plains today amid minimum relative humidity of 8-20%. Widespread elevated to critical conditions are expected in southeast Arizona into southwest and central New Mexico where fuels are driest. Farther north, showers and thunderstorms are expected across much of the northern Intermountain West into the northern High Plains, with the most widespread and heaviest rain falling in south-central Montana. A slow-moving upper-level low will continue to bring showers and scattered thunderstorms from the Great Lakes and Upper Ohio Valley to the Mid-Atlantic and Carolinas, while drier conditions return to Florida. Dry and breezy northeast winds are expected across the Alaska Interior today, while light showers continue along the south coast.
