Predictive Services Discussion:

A few showers will continue across the northern third of the West today, with upper-level ridging bringing dry conditions and above normal conditions to much of the West late this weekend into mid-next week. A deep upper-level trough will then move onto the West Coast late next week, with rain and mountain snow, focused on California. A cold front will bring rain to the Upper Ohio Valley today, with scattered light rain to the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic tonight into tomorrow. It will remain unsettled across the Great Lakes, Mid-Atlantic, and Northeast, with periods of light showers and cold temperatures into mid-next week, including the Southeast. However, little rain will fall on the east slopes of the Appalachians due to downsloping northwest flow. In addition, strong and dry northerly winds will develop behind a cold front across Texas Sunday where elevated to critical conditions are expected. Breezy and dry northerly winds will also develop across the Southeast early next week, with areas of elevated conditions, especially along the northeast Gulf Coast.
