Predictive Services Discussion:

Locally breezy winds are expected across portions of the southern Great Basin, central High Plains, and southeast Atlantic coast today, but otherwise winds will be light across much of the US. Above normal temperatures are expected on much of the Plains to the Mississippi Valley and Great Lakes today, with temperatures 15-25°F above normal in the northern Plains to western Great Lakes. Relative humidity will remain low on the High Plains today, with minima of 12-20%, and locally low humidity will also occur in the Lower Great Lakes, as low as 20-25%. Scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms will continue in the northwestern US, and a band of moderate to heavy rain is expected to develop tonight from the central Sierra into central Idaho. Isolated showers and thunderstorms are likely along the Gulf Coast, with more scattered thunderstorms in Florida, where heavy rain is possible along the east coast. Scattered mixed rain and snow showers are expected in much of the southern half of Alaska, with light sea breezes and scattered showers in Hawai'i.
